their visit here. Och, aye, laddie!! Kevin invited members to purchase the Rotary Lager gift packs of which our club will receive \$6.80 from the sale of each pack, consisting of 4cans and two Rotary glasses. He added that the sales are going very well. Bruce said that being a first-time Grandpa has him navigating the 115 and the 401 to do his babysitting but being an able bodied multi-talented Rotarian, he is enjoying it and rising above it all. He reminded members to donate one item to the Auction in January or reach out to contacts to make a donation. One prize in particular will be repeated again and that is the African Safari trip worth \$5000, and won last year by Bill Crinns. Leading on from Bruce, Bill Crinns provided a brief slide show of his stay at the Zulu Nyala Heritage Safari Park late September and early October this year, where he saw wonderful animals, scenery and bird life. Ken reminded members that the Auction is the club's biggest fund-raiser with the proceeds going to the Homeward Bound Support and Resource Centre. Ken also acknowledged our Paul Harris Award winners, Ray Saitz, Mo Cox, Marie Press and Sue Sharp. Lloyd made Rotarian of the Month presentations to Marie Press, Mo Cox and the Club's Honduras team.

Speakers: Sue Sharp and Marie Press gave a wonderful overview and slide show of their trip to Honduras. Our additional members were Mo, Paul, Moe Grant (the "finemaster"), Leigh Ramsay and Donna-Marie Fennel. Rotarians from North Bay also helped, as did members of 2 local Rotary Clubs in Honduras. First, comments were made by Paul Bodrug, Mo Cox and Moe Grant, all saying what a great trip it had been, great fellowship, a life-changing experience that they would not have missed. However, it shocked everybody to know that "fine-master" Moe Grant implemented a fine program for those late, untidy, uncooperative, but his fine bucket was very empty, except for a 5 cent fine imposed on hairy Mo Cox!! Moe Grant said that he was surprised to learn from the President of one of the club's there that his club adopted an island with the help of RI, that his club with 25 members, has a very healthy bank account...again with just 25 members in his club. How do they do it?

Sue and Marie explained that there was nothing but cooperation and a show of happiness and gratitude by the local Hondurans who rolled up their sleeves and pitched in to help where they could. Living on about \$350 a month, the locals were simply happy that somebody was there to help them with their lives. Marie explained that what was done in Honduras was to be "sustainable" in the key areas of the work they did and that was for a Girls School, a Community Garden and a Teachers Training Centre. There was a particular focus on health and education, with 1000 pairs of glasses being donated, distribution of women's sanitary pads to 250 girls, teaching students to sew and make their own pads, teaching students about finances, saving, growing vegetables and re-selling them to sustain their lives

Repairs and painting was done to the girl's school including installing a security system. A green-house was erected with special netting to keep out insects, a tilapia pond was dug out and prepared for the fish, again with sustainability in mind, from growing the fish, selling them and ensuring there would always be a supply of fish. A solar pump was installed for water retention, irrigation and distribution. One cannot drink the local tap water so bottled water had to be used all the time.

The building of the Teacher's Training Centre was complete, finally, and Marie said one teacher's training costs were paid by Rotary and that person is responsible for networking, training of teachers and working with students. The Centre is used on a daily basis.

Lee and Donna-Marie said that the distribution of eye glasses and sunglasses were a hit with everybody. Many Hondurans could not read and with their new glasses they were so very happy, making the entire volunteer team see their time and effort in everything they did very fulfilling and... they will be ready to return to Honduras in February 2020!

Of course, hard work has to be rewarded with some downtime and this was done at Roatan where the team relaxed by the ocean and recalled the many highlights of their trip including the many hugs, laughter and gratitude shown by the Hondurans towards the entire team for all their hard work to make their (the Hondurans) lives so much better.

In closing Ken provided reminders of upcoming activities and Marie said that members should consider wearing the most ugliest Christmas sweater to the next meeting on December 10th. A prize will be awarded. And Milan reminded Musicfest volunteers they are invited to his home at 7 pm on Dec 12th for a celebration. Contact Milan for more details.
