Bruce did not say that Arch founded Rotary. Moving on... he said that in Judge Alan's absence, congratulations about his recent appointment as a sitting Judge in Nunavet will be made at another time. President Bruce reminded everybody to still seek out donations for the Auction in January and to go on line for fast processing of tickets and tax receipts. Donations could be in the form of photography lessons or a night of fine food catered by chefs extraordinaire Ken and Wayne. President Bruce also thanked Jamie Schmale, MP for Haliburton, Kawartha Lakes and Brock for something I could not remember or decipher from my writing!

**Guest Speaker: Introduced by Betty Halman-Plumley.** Charles "Chuck" Ealey was an outstanding football player who overcame racial barriers while excelling at his sport. An American by birth and having grown up in a tough part of Toledo, Ohio, Chuck moved on and up as a result of his excellent physical and sporting abilities. He is semi-retired as a consultant with the Investors Group. He remembers the assassinations in the 1960's, the Vietnam War, the racial tensions and that he was only one of 5 black kids in high school. He saw sports and football as a way to detach himself from the negativity in society at that time. Having played football a short while in the US, he came to Canada to play a game that the US did not allow him to utilize his full potential as a gifted player. Born in Portsmouth, Ohio, Chuck played high school football and was quarter back for the University of Toledo Rockets, leading them to 35 consecutive wins from 1969 – 1971, an NCAA record that still stands today. In 1971 he was named First Team All American by the "Football News" but was voted 8th overall for the Heisman Trophy. As an American quarterback he was passed over by the 1972 NFL Draft. Chuck came north to Canada and in 1972 he joined the Hamilton TiCats leading them to first place in the

East Division, earning the CFL's Most Outstanding Rookie award and becoming the first black quarterback to lead the TiCats to a Grey Cup victory as well as being nominated the MVP.

Chuck went on to play with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and the Argos. He played seven seasons with three CFL teams, passing for 13,326 yards and 82 touchdowns.

He is an accomplished public speaker, has been the subject of books and TV programs as a pioneer in a sport that was not accepting of non whites at that time. Chuck's story can be found in a book entitled "The Stone Thrower" written by his daughter. A short video showed his friends and colleagues describe Chuck as passionate, caring, committed, an inspiration, focused, a hard worker and person with integrity. All of these attributes allowed him to be a successful certified financial planner with the Investors Group and he was the regional director in Mississauga. His attributes also earned him the Herb Carnegie Award. Herb Carnegie has been described as "the best black hockey player who never played in the NHL." He was a dazzling player with the Quebec Aces, a businessman, a philanthropist, a champion golfer and a recipient of the Order of Canada. However, he could not get to play in the NHL. He died in 2012 at age 92.

It stands to reason why Chuck would be the recipient of the Herb Carnegie Award. Chuck has always believed in the power of goodness in people and he says it comes from his words of inspiration - Inward, Outward and Upward. He encourages people to work as a team, he loves to speak to students and adults alike, he imparts his knowledge of doing things in a spirit of cooperation, of having important values and principals, to be true to yourself and others, and if you think you can make a change and a difference, just do it and not have your feelings and judgment clouded by outside influences. He likened these values to those of Rotary values and what Rotary stands for in the community. Finally, as a bit of humour, he said that Canada has so many good things about it and these values have been taken to heart by some of his friends south of the border who, not receiving Donald Trump well as President elect, want to move to Canada and live here. After answering some questions from members, Rick provided a well-deserved thank-you to Chuck for his presentation.

In closing President Bruce reminded everybody about the BEL Club's 40th Anniversary celebration, the in-club meeting and election of board members on December 5th, the Spelling Bee word submission form and about the Auction, to go online for ticket information.

President Bruce's end of meeting quote is : "I have 6 locks on my door, all in a row. When I go out I lock everyone. I figure no matter how long somebody stands there picking the locks, they are always locking three of them." (a quote from comedienne Elayne Boosler.)
