A quorum being present, the President declared the motion passed.

Nick suggested that we donate socks to help the Warming Room, Brock Mission etc. Stan made the suggestion at the end of our meeting last week there were lots of contributions this week. Colin will handle distribution. I believe we are doing it again next week. Andrew Welk: was happy to have visited 4 countries on his recent European Tour. He attended Rotary meetings in Norway and Holland and also visited Portugal and Spain. While in Spain he connected with a Highschool buddy who is now a pro basketballer in Spain. Tracey Ormond: was happy that her sister came home from China for a weekend visit. Lloyd Graham: was happy to have travelled to Toronto to pick up a second refugee family. President Andi was happy to have participated in about 5Km walk along the Gardiner Expressway. There were some 25,000 people participating to raise awareness for various charities. She was walking for Parkinson's Awareness. Alan Ingram: went out of order and did his Happy Bucks under Announcements. Aren't there special penalties for Judges doing that sort of thing. He was happy to have been to Inuvik, the per capita crime capital of Canada. Due to the dismay of Grumpy, the Judge didn't order any hangings but did dispense some justice.

**Programme**: Our guest speakers today were Pat Hooper, Chairman of the Board of Showplace Peterborough and Beth McMaster,

Chairman of the founding Board of Showplace. Beth spoke of growing up in the area and realizing the need for a performance centre. Over the past 22 years there were various studies conducted all which indicated that Peterborough had a need for a Performance Centre but no funding was forthcoming. In 1991 with the assistance of the late Rotarian Gord Farquharson, Peterborough Showplace was incorporated and certified as a charitable organization. Beth and Erica Cherney plied Doug Armstrong with strong drink and signed him up as Campaign Chairman. They raised \$3.5 million through a combination of local donations and matching funds from the federal and provincial governments, the municipal council declined participation. Tenders were called and local firm Mortloch Construction was signed to remodel the Odeon Theatre.

Pat Hooper then spoke about the current status of the organization. As with most arts related enterprises they are facing some financial challenges but with the assistance of Len Lifchus have arranged focus groups and formulated strategic plans and feel they are on the path to recovery. They have a new interim General Manager, Emily Martin. Their AGM is Tuesday Oct 24 at Ashburnham Funeral Home (not to be confused with Ashburnham Ale House). In previous years Showplace ran a fundraiser called Spring Tonic featuring local talent. It is being revived but as it will be in October and not the Spring it has been renamed Tonic@Twenty. It will take place Sat Oct 28th @ 8:00 pm and Sun Oct 29th at 2:00Pm. Admission is \$25.00. Rumour has it his Honour the Mayor Daryl Bennett may make a guest appearance. No word as to whether Police Chief Murray Rodd will accompany him.

Beth mentioned that the building purchased for Showplace, The Odeon Theatre, was built in 1947 the same year as Council started planning the PARKWAY. The show will reference Parkway Development (or lack there of I'm guessing) through the last 70 years.

Semi retired Judge Alan "The Hanger" Ingram thanked our speakers.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:07 PM.

I had a really great idea for this week, unfortunately due to my advanced years I forgot it before I wrote this bulletin.
