Sally Harding: Meeting of Centennial sub-committee on New Events Sept. 19 at Bercs Steakhouse. Youth Exchange committee meeting Sept. 20 at Holiday Inn at 5:00 pm. Bruce Gravel: LAST CALL today for signing up for Tri-Club Social & Tournament at Peterborough Axe Club this Sunday, Sept. 16 from 1-4 p.m. He brandished a handsome trophy, courtesy of President Ken, which would be awarded to the winner. 2019 Auction Committee would start meeting soon and members are needed to join this fun committee. Auction date: January 26, 2019. This is our club's largest fundraiser that isn't wet.

New Service Project for Club: Service Director Marie Press reviewed the many months of work of her 9-member Service Project Working Group. A club survey had identified Children & Hunger as priorities for our club. Marie's group had contacted/interviewed 9 local agencies. The committee narrowed the field to 2 finalists, and recommended one to the Board for approval: Homeward Bound (HB) Peterborough. The Board had approved and today recommended it to the club. It was a 2-year commitment of \$13,000 per year, funded via our annual Auction. (The Auction typically generates twice that amount each year.) HB's goal: breaking the cycle of poverty for single mothers and their children. This is done through education, then a career with a living wage. The education focus is on trades at Fleming College. The program currently has 4 women and 11 children enrolled. There would be many opportunities for Rotarians to be involved with HB clients, through mentoring, teaching life skills, wise choice shopping, value of volunteering, etc. Info pamphlets were at each table. Program: Cal Langman introduced our recently-elected MPP Dave Smith. Dave started by announcing 2 personal donations to our Auction fundraiser: A signed Ken Dryden hockey card and a rare CBC Hockey Night in Canada towel. Dave outlined his government's priorities: ending the ruinous strike at York University, cancelling the White Pines wind turbine project and 752 other costly "green energy" electrical projects, saving taxpayers \$780 million. Ontario had a large surplus of electricity and didn't need these expensive new projects. His government was ending the cap & trade carbon tax, which sucked \$2.2 billion from our economy. We will still reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Dave opened the floor to questions, and fielded several on various topics.

Sally Harding thanked him. Lloyd promised to deliver his thank-you glass to his office - when it eventually opens.

President Ken adjourned the meeting at 1:17 p.m.
