In response, there was a show of hands of members who are golfers and one member offered to loan Mati a set of clubs. Piero Ronca provided a special greeting to our exchange student in Italian (translation not available). Members were invited to consider inviting Mati to participate in events.

RYLA Presentation: Amy Simpson noted the RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Academy) is a joint initiative of 30 Rotary Clubs. The purpose of the weekend event is to develop in youth leadership and Rotary skill. This year the Peterborough Rotary sent 5 students to the weekend event at Orillia. Amy Simpson introduced Camille (Cami) Press Boily, one of the students. Cami noted she was one of 60 students who attended the weekend. The age range of the participants was 14 to 18. She spent time learning leadership and interpersonal skills. She networked with youth from around the region. She thanked the Club for sponsoring her to attend the camp. She noted she is looking forward to participating on future club activities.

Major Project Discussion: The balance of the meeting was devoted to discussion of the selection of a major project for the next few years by the club. President Van Koeverden reviewed her deliberation and discussions over the weekend regarding the selection of a major project. It has become apparent as a result of the discussions that more discussion is needed before making a final decision. She noted an internet ballot was completed and 47 of the 90 members voted. She noted 43 voted in favour of one of the projects, 4 voted none of the projects and 2 did not vote.

Willis Cleveland noted it was a difficult decision to make whenever a vote is taken. Peter MacLoughlin noted the projects had not been debated internally in the club. Diane Allen wondered why close to 50% of the membership did not vote. There is need to make a group decision. Others members also express concern about the number of people who did not vote. It was noted there were some technical issues for some members and others felt the vote would occur at a meeting, not on-line.

Many members spoke about the need to have time or a meeting to discuss the merits of the three projects internally prior to a decision being made. Cal Langman noted there has to be an open discussion on the projects. Others noted we need to hear from each other.

Ken Trembley noted in order to proceed with more discussion, the results of the vote need to be wiped out.

Motion Moved by Willis Cleveland, seconded by Sara Burke

That any decision on the selection of a major project be deferred until the Club members have had an opportunity to discuss the proposed projects.

Carried

Amendment Moved by Diane Allen, seconded by Willis Cleveland

That the on-line vote previously taken on the major projects be discarded.

Carried

Peter MacLoughlin noted that for a project to succeed the whole club has to support it. Several members commented on the how to proceed. The need for in-club discussions followed by selection was stressed.

President Van Koeverden outlined a procedure to proceed. The outline of the projects will be e-mailed to all members along with the power point presentations made by the applicants. Next week there will be a general discussion on the projects through an In-Club meeting. The vote will be taken at the meeting in two weeks.

President Van Koeverden and members showed their appreciation for the work of Joe Fleming and Joe Hall in the major projects initiative to this point.

Adjournment: The meeting was declared adjourned by President Van Koeverden.
