This Date in History: in 1914 Nova Scotia Nurse Margaret MacDonald volunteered for overseas service with the Canadian Expeditionary Force and became the 1st woman in the British Empire to achieve the rank of Major. In 1980 twenty-two year old marathoner Terry Fox was invested as Companion of the Order of Canada, the youngest person to be so honoured.

Announcements: Marie Press announced additional government sponsored refugees are coming with 17 families by the end of March. She invited anyone who wishes to assist to contact her. Jason Stabler announced the Swimathon meeting will be taking place immediately after this meeting and additional volunteers are welcome. Betsy McGregor provided an update of the Seeds of Change project with Curve Lake First Nation. The completion has been delayed due to the illness of one of the elders. An updated report will be given to the President shortly. She also presented a Happy Buck in memory of MP Mauril Belanger who was responsibe for the gender neutral version of 'O'Canada'. Linn Thain, our Sergeant-at-Arms reviewed the procedure for makeup meetings. President Bruce Gravel announced the Club's donation, last week's fines and other donations total \$1,325 and are being forwarded to the Rotary Club of Genova, Italy for Earthquake Relief. The recommendation of the Council of Legislation has been reviewed by the Board and will be reviewed by the Membership Committee next week. A full report will be made later to members.

Speaker: Colin MacKenzie introduced today's presenters Lesley Heighway and Rebecca Huels from the Peterborough Regional Hospital Foundation and reviewed their accomplishments.

Lesley Heighway noted the role of the Foundation was to fund the acquisition of state-of-the-art medical equipment and technologies. She reviewed the various roles of the hospital from a Regional Centre of Excellence for specific procedures, Regional Referral Programme for additional procedures, and local procedures. The visitations to the various departments was shown. Heighway then reviewed examples of improved patient care made possible through equipment and technologies funded by the Foundation, especially in the areas of Cardiac, Neonatal and Labour and Delivery, Palliative Care Unit, Doctor Recruitment, upper extremity surgery and minimally invasive surgery procedures.

Heighway then highlighted the success of the Peterborough Dragon Boat Festival and introduced the Festival Chair, Debbie Keay, who was in attendance. She highlighted the statistics related with breast health at the PRHC. The successes are due to the generosity of the donors in Peterborough. The 5-year survival rate for breast cancer is now 88%. The Funds from the current Dragon Boat Festival are being used to purchase 3-D Imaging Equipment. She thanked the Rotary Club for supporting and participating in the Dragon Boat Festival. A short testimonial by a patient of the breast assessment programme was played.

Wendy Hill, based on her experience, thanked Lesley and Rebecca for their presentation and noted we need our Hospital and our Hospital needs us.

Bruce Gravel thanked Colin MacKenzie for organizing the Dragon Boat Festival team for the past three years and noted the registration costs are now included in the current budget.
