Happy Bucks: Betty Halman-Plumley was happy as she is now able to walk to the meeting from her company's new office building and invited all Rotarians to the Open House on October 6 at 1 p.m.; *Gordon Fallen* for his daughter Robin's handbook for Resident Doctors being picked up by Apple as an app.; *Ken Seim* for his 7 am trip to the rink on Saturday morning to take his twin grandsons to their hockey practise and for the planning meetings on the weekend for the upcoming Scot Curling Tour, which are going well. He announced Roaring Rotarian will be featured at the events. Andi van Koeverden gave toonies, as she handed in her hoarded Happy Bucks, for the success of the Friday am Breakfast Club with a chef to make exciting breakfasts and for being able attend a meeting (missed several due to work); and Marie Press for receiving confirmation of the order of her Teslsa 3, which she will probably receive in two years.

Announcement: Colin MacKenzie reported that members of the Rotary Dragon Boat team attended the photo session last week and although the amount is not yet announced it exceeds last year's amount. Colin MacKenzie reviewed the thank-you from Sister Ruth Hennessey for last week's food donation to Casa Maria. President Bruce Gravel announced there will be a Board meeting on Wednesday at 5:30 p.m. at the Holiday Inn and the Membership Committee is meeting immediately after this meeting. He also announced he and Francis will attending the showing of 'Ain't Misbehaving' at Showplace on Saturday, October 1st at 2 p.m. along with members of the Peterborough-Kawartha Rotary Club. Speaker: Alan Ingram introduced our guest speaker, Peter Jennings, and reviewed aspects of his career and accomplishments.

Peter Jennings addressed the club on his book 'Shark Attack' co-authored with Nicole Moore about her experience after being attacked by a Bull Shark off Cancun, Mexico. He reviewed the accolades the book has received and noted it quickly went into a second printing. He reviewed the process on how the book was researched and written. Nicole Moore lost 60% of her blood after the attack and lost part of her left arm and part of her thigh. Her life was saved in Mexico and the medical intervention continued in Toronto. He reviewed her inspiration story Nicole Moore and her very positive attitude despite the attack. She is an inspiration speaker. He played a video of an interview with Nicole about the attack.

He reviewed the process in researching and writing the book. He noted the many interviews he had with Nicole from different perspectives such the victim and from a medical person. Witnesses to the event were also interviewed along with Shark experts. The story for the attack is a story about a series of events coming together resulting in the attack. The presence of the shark was known by the adjacent resort but no warning was given to the users of the adjacent beach and the bull shark was being harassed by two jet-skiers. The attack of a shark on a human is a very rare event, less than the chance of being hit by lighting.

Peter Jennings read part of Chapter 5 which detailed the unusual events leading up to the attack.

He highlights the medical treatment received in Mexico.

In summary he noted he is a better person for researching and writing the book.

Colin MacKenzie thanked Peter Jennings for his presentation of this inspirational tale.
