Brian's hobbies have included golfing, skiing and curling, but he had to give up skiing and curling because of balance problems. Brian and Laurie love to travel and in particular they enjoy cruises. He has also served on the boards of the Aldergrove Credit Union and the Otter Co-op. Brian also taught some of our Rotary Club members.
