

PROJECTS

The Board of Directors at its first official meeting on Monday, July 13th adopted two projects on behalf of the club:

- a) Student Rotarian Program where each year we will make the student body president of Arlington, Darrington, Marysville and Stanwood High Schools students members to attend our membership meetings and each time to bring a different student guest. Arlington & Marysville Presidents will serve the first semester of the year and Darrington & Stanwood Presidents the second semester. Income from the fines collected will go towards supporting this program.
- b) Senior Citizens of North County has been adopted as another project and presently Frank Mallory is busy appointing a committee to spear-head this project in cooperation with the Senior Citizens of North County Board of Directors.

ATTENDANCE

Now that we have been officially admitted to Rotary International, attendance at meetings become very important. SO, if you must miss one, please make it up at another club and then inform the secretary of your make-up. Attendance rules will be strictly aheared too.

"Service Above Self"

We have taken on many service projects since we were founded twenty-five years ago. One of our earliest favorites was the Stillaguamish Senior Center. Club members helped roof the main hall when it was built. Rotary organized the first endowment fund for the Center. We have had many fund-raisers for the senior center, including the very popular Oktoberfests and a couple of Reno nights.

In recent years we have turned our attention to the youth of our community. Funds have been raised to assist with the building of the Arlington Community Youth Center (Boys & Girls Club) and the North Marysville Y.M.C.A.

The local scout council has also benefited from our generosity. In addition to helping with their annual fund drive, we took on the project of building camping shelters for the Fire Mountain Scout Reservation, east of Big Lake.

On the international front, service has been primarily through Rotary International programs.

We have hosted over a dozen foreign exchange students. We have also raised over \$10,000.00 for the Rotary Foundation's PolioPlus program. PolioPlus has been a world wide success.

Dr. Leon Aller, a Snohomish Rotarian. convinced us to turn our attention to his mission in Guatemala. We have helped roof his clinic, provide a vehicle, and sent medical and dental supplies.

Arlington's Frontier Days has also been the beneficiary of our efforts. WE ARE PROUD OF OUR SERVICE!

Fund-raising: From Watermelons to Rubber Duck Races

Fund-raising has returned to nearly where it started. From our humble beginnings, at the not so very popular watermelon booth at Arlington's Frontier Days parade, we have returned to Frontier Days with the now famous *Great Stilly Duckdash*.

To make some comparisons, in 1972, as reported in the LINE, total receipts for the club was \$1,487.22. From the 1994 duck race we netted over \$24,000.00.

For many years the popular Oktoberfest was our main stay for fund-raising. An annual Rotary auction, discontinued after Duckdash success, raised thousands of dollars. A joint auction with the then newly chartered Marysville Rotary Club, started a tradition of raising thousands of dollars for Marysville. They now raise more money with their auction than we raise racing ducks.

By the way, the watermelon stand netted \$3.85!
