## **Mentor Checklist**

All new members are expected to accomplish a series of activities as they progress from transitional members to full membership in good standing. As a mentor it is your responsibility to lead the mew member through these activities. You should communicate regularly with the new member, answering questions and encouraging action, and accompanying the new member in activities as needed.

These activities are listed in the "Passport to Membership" and require a signature as each is completed. The first eleven pages of the Passport can be completed in your first meeting with the new member.

First eleven pages of the Passport completed:
Review pages 1 – 4
Log in, review, edit profile and send an email to all members on ClubRunner
Access and review Member Directory
Review Rotary dues, lunch and initiation costs
Complete the new member Inventory of Interests (You can print this from ClubRunner)
Guide new member in choosing committee participation
Service Time:
Participate in any service project
Fellowship Time:
Mentor discussion of "Fireside" and participate in a Fireside or Exchange Student event
All About You:
Schedule your Classification Talk
Autographs:
Serve as greeter twice and get 13 signatures of current members and note their occupation
We're Committed:
Attend a minimum of 8 weekly meetings
Optional Tasks – Complete 3 of these 5 activities
1. Club Service: Do two of the following:
Help with set-up/breakdown at a meeting Lead the Four Way Test at a meeting
Lead the Flag salute at a meeting Give the invocation/inspirational message at a meeting
2. Board Meeting:
Attend a Board meeting
3. Other Clubs:
Attend a meeting at a different club (obtain a make-up slip from the club you're visiting)
4. District 5050:
Attend a District 5050 meeting or event
5. Foundation:
Donate to the Rotary Foundation

When these activities are completed and the Passport to Membership has been signed off, inform the Membership Chair and your mentee will be awarded their permanent membership badge.
