CLUB HISTORY

The Rotary Club of Bellingham was founded September 17, 1917. It was the 331st club in the world, with over 46,000 clubs to follow! In its long history of service, the RCOB has included many of this area's most notable personages. In fact, the Club has a significant list of cherished older members; several have been in Rotary for over 50 years!

If you join our Club, you are joining an organization who has given millions back to the community and has been instrumental in developing many parks and attractions that are utilized in Whatcom County as well as helping those in need. We hope you will join us and be a part of that tradition!

Throughout the years RCOB has carried out an impressive number of community and international projects. The long list includes playgrounds, soccer fields, parks (including Boulevard Park), YMCA's and YWCA's, Scouts, the city pool; environmental projects, and more. To support these efforts, the Club has had many fund-raising projects including raffles, circuses, and more.

How much money have we given? Well, one study shows over \$4,000,000 donated in recent years since the Club starting keeping careful, annual track. This money went to over 250 separate charities!

Major gifts through 2024 of between \$75,000- \$100,000 each include the Bellingham Food Bank, Bellingham Swimming Pool, Bellingham Technical College, Bellingham Theatre Guild, Boys & Girls Club, Brigid Collins House, Hospice House, Lighthouse Mission, Rotary International Foundation, Rotary Polio Plus Campaign, Remodeling the Sun House, The Whatcom Museum, the YWCA, Lydia Place, the parking lot at Galbraith Mountain, the Recovery House by the Opportunity Council, the Max Higbee Center, the Community Boating Center, Whatcom Center for Early Learning, and the Lighthouse Mission. During our 2017-18 100th anniversary year, over \$400,000 was added to our scholarship endowment which provides more than \$90,000 per year to deserving young scholars.

The long history of the Club stands as testimony to the hard work of the hundreds of Members and officers who, through the years, have never forgotten the Rotary motto, "Service Above Self".

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EXPECTATIONS OF ROTARIANS



DUES

- \$450 Annual Dues (non-tax-deductible)
- \$200 Annual Assessment for Basic Club Charities (tax-deductible)
