There are lots of opportunities to get to know folks from all over the range of interests, ages, and businesses. "Rotation" among businesses is how the organization got its name. Many younger Rotarians have found a lifetime mentor among our Club's outstanding citizens! There are few Bellingham gatherings that have as much knowledge and authority as this Rotary Club!

In addition to our meetings, there are outside activities for regular socializing, an annual ski trip, potluck dinners, an annual day traveling by volunteer Members' boats for a picnic lunch, and various other events and excursions.



MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Membership in the Club follows an application process to verify that we are a good match:

- If you are not getting to know us through a current Member, our Club's Executive Secretary will connect you to one. In either case, your Club connection or the Member you are paired with will be your guide through the process.
- You will be invited to be our guest at a meeting, and be introduced by that guiding Member. Additional meetings will follow.
- You will be asked to file an application with references.
- The application will be reviewed by several committees, then it will be submitted to the Club's Board of Directors for approval. If the Board approves, your name will be published in our bulletin so Members can comment.
- If all goes as expected, you will be contacted and presented with an official badge signifying you are a new member of our Club!
