

WHAT IS END POLIO NOW?

Since Rotary and its partners launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988, the incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99.9 percent from about 300,000 per year to fewer than 10 in 2022. Today, polio remains endemic only in Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly three billion children in 122 counties from this paralyzing disease.

To sustain this progress, and protect all children from polio, Rotary is committed to continue working to keep countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped, within 10 years, polio could paralyze as many as 200,000 children each year.
