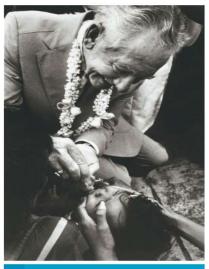

## The roots of Rotary's polio eradication efforts

When James L. Bomar Jr., then RI president, put the first drops of vaccine into a child's mouth, he ceremonially launched the Philippine poliomyelitis immunization effort. Rotary's first Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) Grant project was underway.

#### Guiding Principles - Object of Rotary

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarians occupation to serve society.

THIRD: the application of the ideal of service in each Rotarians personal, business and community life.

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Four-Way Test

The four-way test is a non-partisan and non-sectarian ethical guide for Rotarians to use for their personal and professional relationships. The test has been translated into more than 100 languages, and Rotarians recite it at club meetings:

#### Of the things we say or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

#### **Avenues of Service**

We channel our commitment to service at home and abroad through Five Avenues of Service, which are the foundation of club activity.

- 1. <u>Club Service</u> focuses on making clubs strong. A thriving club is anchored by strong relationships and an active membership development plan.
- 2. <u>Vocational Service</u> calls on every Rotarian to work with integrity and contribute their expertise to the problems and needs of society.
- 3. <u>Community Service</u> encourages every Rotarian to find ways to improve the quality of life for people in their communities and to serve the public interest.
- 4. <u>International Service</u> exemplifies our global reach in promoting peace and understanding. We support this service avenue by sponsoring or volunteering on international projects, seeking partners abroad and more.
- 5. <u>Youth Service</u> recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professionals through leadership development programs such as Rotaract, Interact, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, and Rotary Youth Exchange.

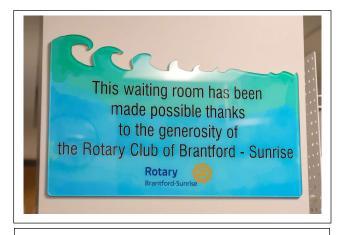

#### 2024-2026 Club Strategic Plan

Undertake all Member Involvement in a comprehensive survey that establishes goals and actions for 2024-2026.

#### **Club Level**

- Provide club members with a summary of Board meeting outcomes each month through Club Secretary.
- Committee Corner: each committee chair to share with members their activities and needs for support.
- Expand and maintain an up-to-date club history on the website: listing activities, fundraisers, supported organizations, photos and presentations at club meetings.
- Hold one social event per month with invitations to satellite club and Friday club.
- Continue with Signature Fundraising events: Trip of the Month, On-line Auction and Canada Day activities including the Beer Garden and Parking.
- Explore the addition of mini-fundraisers through a new mini-fundraiser committee
- Schedule classification talks with new members in a timely manner.
- On-board new members effectively and timely.
- Enhance new member experience, especially in critical first 3-6 months.
- Create and maintain a speaker list for PODS and classification talks.
- Establish a small committee to secure 2 keynote speakers per year.
- Increase overall membership by a net 2 new members.
- Add 2 to 3 corporate memberships
- Hold a minimum of one-two club membership fundraiser per year examples: (wine draw or dinner for two)
- Reduce the number of committees by combining or modifying.
- Fit DEI focus into membership committee

#### **Community Level**

- Provide more outreach to and interaction with cultural and indigenous groups, youth groups as examples. The objective is for our club to better serve the diversity of our community.
- Donate \$1000 per month to community agencies and groups directly through POD member activities.
- Continue with Hands on Activities such as serving dinner bi-monthly to youth at the Whynot Centre on Colborne St and Christmas dinner: Poinsettias to seniors at retirement and care homes: Spring and Fall

- Grand River clean ups in support of the larger Rotary Great Lakes clean up initiative, tree planting, Christmas parade.
- Enhance hands-on activities with the addition of at least two new activities and consider whether some can serve as a monthly social Examples in 2025-2026 include The Birthday Cake Project and serving meals at The Blessing Center.
- Continue with the Youth Exchange and Youth Service programs with on-going ROTEX involvement.
- Continue to identify local organizations with needs we can assist with through donations.

#### **Vocational Level**

- Continue with Rotary Minute and Classification talks,
- Continue with "going to the Community" to recognize deserving community Leaders and volunteers with 3 Paul Harris Fellowship Awards (1-2 years)
- Recognize vocational gaps (refer to Laurie McIntyre's presentation a year ago) and devise a membership strategy to target these gaps (education, medical are examples).

#### **International Level**

- Every Rotarian Every Year Support for the Rotary Foundation 100% individual member support (to receive District recognition)
- Support Polio Plus fund raisers in efforts to have Polio eradicated (minimum \$2500)
- Actively participate in the global grant and the district project grant process – both financial and hands on support.
- Participate in the Great Lakes watershed water clean up
- Actively participate in the Cluster Grant (Global) process

#### **Action Steps to Achieve Goal:**

- 1. Work with existing membership chair and one existing corporate member to finalize plan and kickstart initiative
- 2. Assess resources and tools available to us to ensure success (Chamber membership opportunities, existing member connections, sponsor and volunteer network, donation recipient organizations, free directories, promotional opportunities, and materials available, including new piece by existing corporate member for testimonial purposes.
- 3. Develop a 'sales funnel' and associated follow-up tactics with the goal of one new corporate member per quarter assign a membership team member to selected follow-ups, understanding that to get 5 new corporate members, we will need a sales funnel approximately 5x that number (example: 25 minimum to get 5).
- 4. Ensure at least three of the potential 5 are identified organizations with familiarity and ties to Rotary (warm leads).
- 5. Ensure a strong on-boarding process is in place, suited to corporate memberships.

#### **Helpful People or Tools:**

- 1. Assess marketing resources for goal benefits statement
- 2. Meet with Membership Chair and Committee including existing corporate member
- 3. Produce a marketing plan including social media strategy
- 4. Work the plan and monitor success

#### **POD Duties**

A POD is made up with club members which fairly divides the tasks up among the membership. It is important that all POD members do their part and contribute to the organization of meetings and socials.

#### Preparation before your month:

- The POD will arrange for a social event that will be different each month and designed to include spouses, partners, family members and friends. This event is in lieu of a meeting on the first Wednesday of the month. The event does not have to be held on the Wednesday.
- Coordinate speakers at least a month in advance. Try to have speakers that
  align with the monthly theme or significant time of the year (e.g. Black History
  Month). Post speakers on the Club Runner calendar and inform PR committee of
  prominent speakers that should be promoted as early and as widespread as
  possible. Provide brief bios for the introducer.
- Arrange to include a Rotary minute or brief classification talk, one per month (not in lieu of a speaker). Consider our Club's History as a subject of interest.
- POD leader to assign meeting duties to POD members using provided form (attach) and submit form to President prior to start of their month along with brief speaker bios.
- Select recipient of \$1000 monthly POD donation. There must be a request to the Treasurer via e-mail to issue funds. Funds can be split into smaller amounts (eg 2x\$500). Donations must be provided to registered charitable organizations.
- Arrange for at least one new prospective member to attend a meeting.

#### **Duties at the meeting:**

- ARRIVE by 6:45am to set up front table, speakers' lectern and audio/visual equipment as necessary. Assist speaker(s) to set up their presentation.
- Take attendance of members and guests and provide to Secretary. Ensure all members and guests pay with cash or eTransfer. The following are exempt from payment: guest speakers, cheque recipients, exchange students, potential members first 3 meetings.
- Greet attendees, especially guests and prospective members and introduce to President, President Elect, Secretary and members.
- Sell 50l50 elimination draw tickets and place all tickets and cash in a bin.
- Provide cash, attendance sheet, and 50-50 draw tickets to club Secretary.
- Collect fines and happy bucks during SAA session.
- Introduce and thank guest speaker.
- Collect name tags from members at end of meeting and put away front table, lectern, and audio-visual supplies.
