7. Today's Presentation –Lance introduced today's speaker, our very own Carolyn Mullin who will be sharing her Niagara College story today!

Carolyn. Research and Innovation. It's not tied to any school. Applied Research is when you apply Research to Industry. Everything in Niagara College has an outside industry partner. This has been going on for 25 years but since July 2011 and 200 Million, we have 3 new buildings, more than 2500 programs and services with more than 550 faculty members and 1500 students! Innovation Centres match programs. Project teams provide tech leads and paid students. **Niagara College is in the top 10 and placed in Top 50 Research Colleges.** Any inkind, actual funding is cash from Individual Partners.

Tech Services charge a fee for service. There's Applied Research and Course Based Research within the classroom.

Students and Faculty have descriptions of what they've done. Actual Innovation Centres have added a Media division. Also a Lemon Drink- cold and wonderful. 'Upubalabo!'

Walker Advanced Management Innovation Centre is scanning from the size of a dime to the whole building. Recent partners include Darling Mimosa, Sobrii – O Alcohol, Airbus Helicopters, Raw Pest Food, Greenhouse Tech Network with Niagara College, Vineland Research and Innovation, University of Guelph, SONAM, Conestoga, Fleming, George Brown and Queen and a few more. Feds and Province are regular funders. Last year – 235 projects!

Question. For small business, it must be a struggle to have a good website.

Lance. South of the border and tariffs – are we looking at more aggressive looking afield like South America?

Paul. With state of immigration, how does it impact school?

Carolyn. It has a hugely negative impact. Province does fund student activity. Work permits have been frozen by the feds – ALL college programs. We *need* trades. We didn't catch up with housing. Now we have to figure out how to. Funding is 4 local students to 1 International. Those International students used to have to have \$10,000 in a Canadian account. Now it's \$25,000! **Layoffs** are coming; we won't be able to avoid them. Our funding is definitely based on working with industry.
