4. Introduction of Guest Speaker Danielle Horodenchuk, YRN by Mike Taylor

Danielle is Mike's replacement at YRN and he is very happy about it and about Danielle's previous experience and knowledge as well as her passion for the work he knows so well. **Danielle.** Thanks to all of you for your support of YRN through your golf tournament. It's so much appreciated especially with the cutbacks on the government's side.

We have 3 houses for ages 12-19. We support an average of 160 Youth each year. We've been working for 4 decades since 1979. That first home, named Juvenile Detention Niagara Inc operated as a 10 bed, Open Detention/group home residence. Here they could have contact and connections close to home.

In 2000 the Agency opened a second, 11 bed home behind the original one. In 2001, we refocused our effort on the growing need for group homes to service high risk/needs young people. In 2006, we changed our name to Youth Resources Niagara Incorporated. In 2019, in collaboration with FACS (Family and Children's Services Niagara) we opened a 9 bed residential home for female youth, Genesis!

Our vision is to provide access to and support the individuals and the programs for 12-19 youth experiencing or at risk of, homelessness.

Across all our programs we have onsite clinical therapy, physical education is always a goal,, social skill training, goal setting (reviewed each week), gardens on site, recreational activities, life lessons.

We work with the police and other agencies. We support extrajudicial sanctions and measures, detention support, custody support. **A new development is an additional home** – some are being housed outside of Niagara – we can bring them in. They'll prepare meals and eat together. We want them to feel at home. We do things with them that they haven't done before, e.g. going to the park etc. **We've had 3 Youth who have graduated**.

Most of them when they arrive have hit a very low point in life including addiction and mental health problems. Our goal is to help and support these youth.

Paul Big Brother Big Sister uses mentorship and spending a few hours/week with their little brothers, little sisters. Danielle FAC –youth is taken into care. We are seeing Youth as young as
12. We want to ensure we catch kids early.

Troy. It's always a struggle especially in times of inflation. I'm pleased we can support YRN with a golf tournament. How does Niagara Region hold up to other regions?

Danielle. There's only one other pilot project running. There's been a decrease in the budget for us.

Collins. I have a question about the surrounding family connection. How does YRN connect with families?

Danielle. Sometimes we don't have direct contact.

We DO have within 1 day and appointment with the family. We encourage family visits. They can go home on weekends. We include families in all our planning.

Carolyn. Thank you, Danielle, for your passion and your work. As a thank you to our speakers, we make a donation in your name to Pelham Cares.
