7. Today's Presentation – Frank introduced Kristina Clint, Manager of Recreation, Community and Culture, Town of Pelham. Kristina works with Vickie Ravenswaay.

Kristina's Presentation. I started in this role in October 2024. Prior to that, since 2018, I used to work in Beamsville. I'm excited to be working in Pelham!

Present Key Dates. May 1st – Parks and Public washrooms opened as well as tennis and pickleball courts. **May 24th**. Weekend Splash Pads open. Upcoming town events include: Earth Week's Pelham spokesperson for **Earth Day Canada Mobilizing** Municipalities and Cities that take action for a sustainable future. Recreation updates include Pelham Aquatics and Skating continuing plus Gym classes. The Arts and Culture update is the **Community Mural is up**. The Pelham Cultural Advisory Council is **decorating 3 lighting boxes in Downtown Fenwick**.

Ther is a **Citizenship ceremony on Friday May 16**th **at MCC in partnership with Immigration, Refugees and Citizens Canada.** The update on the **MCC Concession** is that there will be a **16month pilot project whose goal is to streamline service** -so many are here in the morning including track, etc. There are also upcoming plans for pool renewal. There is also, with regard to facilities, a new policy – Service Animals Only – we did a best practices research.

Any questions? There seem to be a lot of extra costs! Kristina. We only apply for grants that cover cost and find some matching grants. For Participaction, Pelham Advisory Committee has two fold reasons – grants cover for extras, courses are covered and memberships cover repairs. Summer Chill? What are the plans? Kristina Putting benches on trails. No capital funds. Summerfest? Kristina No major thing sticks up.

Frank. The town hosted a **meeting with all the service clubs** but it hasn't happened in awhile. Take the message back to our town that it helped to know what we were all doing. There is \$3 ½ Million (highest estimate) for trades and grants. **FH to Thorald trail needs to be completed** from the waterfront trail to the linking of trails. We just need some money. The Thorald grant application has gone in. If it happens it'll be done this year. 3 benches on Merritt are part of the trail. It used to be lovely grassy space – Kristine will follow up.

A few more notices – Lacrosse still needs indoor space during the day. Summer camps can use indoor space too in case of rain.
