**Ryan Bradford, Youth Exchange student from D7090 to Belgium.** Youth Exchange was a very long process to be accepted. Once there, School was very strict. There were 8 hour days except for Wednesday which was 4 hours long. I travelled to various places on weekends and Wednesday afternoons. I went to 50 different places in that time. I spoke French from the 2<sup>nd</sup> day.

I LOVED my Science teacher! Every time I came into the room, whether September or May I'd be greeted with 'Ryan! Canada!' I soon started with my French greeting for him! My first home stay father asked me if I'd like to play Basketball with his son. I said yes, not knowing I'd be playing on the basketball team all year! The first home family helped me get my bearings and were strict about speaking French which was great. I felt right at home with my second family, even the grandmother! And the third family was made up of the kindest people I've ever known.

Belgium Incoming YE. There were 80 inbound Youth Exchange students. I was worried about meeting and relating to all 80 but it turned out to be very easy. On Wednesdays and Saturdays, we did things as a group. At Christmas, we delivered food to poor people. I travelled to 8 countries including France, Netherlands, Germany, Italy, Vatican, Belgium and Luxembourg. I went to many Christmas Markets. I loved Germany especially! Italy was cool. We went to Venice, San Marino, Vatican Rome and Florence. Luxembourg was the last organised event.

I also got one of my wishes and went to a Euro Match!

My friend and I tried 8 places for their Friend Fries and chose the best in the photo I chose to share. **The BEST Fries ever!** 

**Ryan.** I learned a lot of leadership, for instance, knowing how to adapt to unknown situations. I texted my family during my first home stay but stopped with the next – I grew up. At my going away party, I heard comments that I'd changed the most of my youth exchange counterparts.

**Did I meet my goals?** 1. To be fluent in French. 2. Do well in school? 3. See and understand the world? **Yes to all.** Also, I was granted entry to senior year in Belgium so don't need to repeat Grade 11 here!
