Carol Nagy. Niagara Falls born and raised, Carol was initially a social worker in Toronto where she helped develop programs especially for the Indigenous community. She returned to the area in 2013 as Executive Director at Hospice Niagara, working with staff, more than 350 volunteers and a Board of Directors to help people and their families live well by providing exceptional and compassionate care, to everyone, everywhere, every time.

Carol's vision for Niagara is for people to have access to the best palliative care close to home, when they need it most. Under her leadership, hospice care in the region will be expanding with the planned construction of two new hospice Centres of Excellence and the addition of 20 new hospice beds.
