6. Budget Meeting.

Ann. The Board has approved the budget. It's a Debit/Credit, Out and In. There are notes for this year and coming year. I'm not the treasurer, that's Randy.

People pay dues and happy loonies.

The Niagara Auction is a group effort with 6 clubs. We can count on at least \$15,000 for our community work. Starts in September with online viewing available November

Purse Bingo this November 7th is a designated fundraiser because we need a license and therefore need to identify recipients of our fund raising – PATHSTONE Youth Counselling at MCC and Pelham Cares

Donations come in. Kwik Fit donating \$500 toward Legion's Annual Poppy Campaign. \$500 from LG for Youth Services. Paul S and Team Cornhole Tournament \$3000. 4H Plowing Tournament – we'll receive \$\$ for volunteering at the 4H Food truck.

General Expenses include Name Tags, PO Box rental, Host Families \$300/month. YE Student gets \$150 monthly allowance, Interact and Family Cheer at Christmas, \$2000 for Crossley scholarships.

Events we support: Bandshell Concert one night, Temperanceville, Canada Day (Sno Cones do make \$\$), Paul Harris Evening – (try to run at 0 balance - \$500 budget in case), Cluster Grants - \$1300 CDN, District Grant – not this year, \$1000 for Poppy at Legion (500 KF). \$1000 discretionary, \$500 kept for Migrant Workers, \$4000?

Dues. We get invoiced from RI, District 7090.

Clubrunner – we pay for it. Lions 80th. \$1000 for Peace Pole. Reserve Fund in background – we have money in the bank.
