7. Introduction to Guest Speaker, Emily Fieguth, Fundraising Coordinator of Start Me Up Niagara, Emily Fieguth - Hugh. Please welcome Emily Fieguth, Fundraising Coordinator at Start Me Up Niagara. In her role, Emily helps drive the agency's mission to support individuals in our community who are facing poverty, food insecurity, and precarious housing. She leads key fundraising efforts and community events, most notably the Coldest Night of the Year walk in St. Catharines bringing people together to raise both awareness and vital support for those experiencing significant barriers.

A lifelong Niagara resident, Emily has lived in St. Catharines, Welland, Virgil, and Niagara-on-the-Lake, giving her a deep connection to the region and the people it serves. **Today, she's here to speak about these urgent local challenges and to share how Start Me Up Niagara is creating meaningful change through collaboration, compassion, and community engagement.**Outside of work, Emily enjoys staying active and connected to nature cycling with the Niagara 'Glowriders,' hiking the Bruce Trail, and exploring the natural beauty of the region she's proud to call home. **Welcome Emily!**

Emily's Presentation. Thanks for inviting me to speak! I've put out information packs over there for people to help themselves.

PPT. This is us – our team! Who we are – our words are important to us.

Filling out forms is most important to people who are struggling. We do that.

1 in 5 people are a paycheque away from living on the street. Our Resource Centre is a point of connection. Trust is hard to get – it can take a long time. We deal with the entire Niagara region. We have a beautiful connection with REACH – it keeps people out of Emergency. Partnership with REACH includes Working on the Streets. Welcoming presence. This is Jeff, someone close to my heart. He's been in foster homes, on the streets with a brain injury that prohibited working for a living. Working with us, he now works on the street (making money) talking to people who are where he used to be and helping them GET help!

Pop-Up Market – People pay what they can.

Niagara Mobile Chest, Bike Me Up - \$60 cost- half goes back to the worker, **Tool Box** – packed one night and distributes the next day. A few ways to build trust, help with getting a job, etc. Everything relies on building trust.

Giving. Volunteers gave **\$19,000** between parades and our Coldest Night event. We have 3rd party funded events. We receive grants and donor funds. We also have a quarterly newsletter to keep donors and members in touch with us.

QUESTIONS. Are you in any way connected with the Pelham community? Emily. Not personally, but the regional organisations keep track of it. Hugh. What has surprised me is that they've been here 25 years! Emily. We're all leaning on each other (the 'helping' groups), Costco is also very helpful and generous with food stuffs – we get stuff from them twice a week. RAFT takes care of children.

Frank. How many staff? Do you get anything from government? Emily. We have 24 PT and FT. We get no money from the government. Frank. What are your revenues? Emily. \$ 1 Million. It's down right now as many of are our donors are now our clients! Frank. Thank you so much! It's amazing what you are doing. For every guest speaker this year, we are donating in your name to Pelham Cares.
