Crosley Christmas Families. Ann. 9 am on Tuesday is pickup time for delivering to Salvation Army who is organising the distribution. They're looking for non-perishable items for families. Members buying items can bring toys/food/nonperishable to my place by Sunday. Tuesday's pickup time changed to 830 am.

Guest Speaker today is The Boyce Family sharing Will's Power Foundation. The six members of the Boyce family delivered this presentation together. Ben, Trent (both at EL Crossley), Will (at St Anne's), Abrielle, Jen and Kevin, mom and dad. Presentation. Will's Power Foundation and the Family itself helps other kids who develop this rare disease, Lymphangiomatosis. Both Foundation and Family raise awareness in the public and the right information gets out there.

In 2019, Will became ill. The lymphatic system that drains the lymph was not working properly. Will's version is life threatening. The PPT will show the medical information. WillsPower.org is the website. **The main goal of the Foundation is to provide hope** because it's poorly understood and there is not ONE centre in Canada doing the work. Vascular doctors do see them but there is no help at home, 150 kids are seen by 1 Doctor. Usually, he sees kids with cancer!

Will's Power's big goal is to establish a clinic in Canada, to educate the public as well as provide practical support to patients.

- **Q. How rare is the disease?** The Clinic at Sick Kids has 150 kids. There are 2 of Will there. You have to be your own best advocate.
- Q. What's the network like in the US? There are 4 major centres that do research as well.
- Q. Any environmental causes? Not that we know.

Becky Utz. Will. You're an excellent young man – I wish you were in my class – if I were still teaching! **Jan.** Will has been stable this last year: puberty and the trauma of Covid could be a trigger.
