- 6. **President Updates, Correspondence. Holiday Social** Friday December 15 at Culinary Dropout. **This week's speaker. Nicole Guthrie** will speak on Immigration Law.

Purse Bingo's main recipient of designated winnings went to Pathstone Foundation. Lorraine Snihur is here to accept appreciated donation and tell us a bit about Pathstone. Pathstone is the Children's Mental Health lead in Niagara. The more we talk about it the more we know. Since October 1<sup>st</sup>, we've taken over intake for everyone in this field, either for a program or the right to a counsellor. We hope by April not to have a wait period. With our walk-in clinics over the past year, 12,000 have used the services. We're giving them skills and strategies right away, Pathstone gets \$9M from the government and we need \$14M for the year. We see 20,000 youth/children for 1 day/week. We're seeing that it's working and we're working with the families as well. We do see a bigger spike coming. The don't need a medical card or a referral. 11.4 is the average age. 75% if Mental Health problems stem from childhood. If we can help now, it can produce a happy adult.

Carolyn. This year's RI President has Mental Health as a focus.

**Today's Guest Speaker, Nicole Guthrie is welcomed by Paul Snack.** Nicole has a degree in Political Science as well as law and spent 10 years providing immigration legal services in Don Valley. Now she's here for Niagara immigration services!

**Nicole** works with **express entry**. It includes skilled workers with 1 year experience in Canada, Federal skilled workers, those with a trade –anyone with a skilled trade. There are different types of work permits. Wages and work must meet regulations. There are **International Mobility Apps for temporary work** for example at Walmart. Also, the App can be for youth. An 18-30 year old can work in Canada for a year but it's non renewable!

There are **study permits** where they must show a certain level of money in a GIC. Now that amount is \$20,000 plus Health Insurance There are sponsorships including spousal and family, other relations. To sponsor, you must be 18, with status as a citizen, registered Indian and not receiving assistance. **WHO can be sponsored**? Spouse, common law partner, conjugal partner, a family member, a spouse or dependent child. Common Law is defined here as living together for a year. **Refugees** are those who face risk of persecution back home where they may be persecuted because of race, religion, nationality, being a member of particular social or political groups.

There are some exclusions with refugees where those with refugee status can't apply again. Previous refugees have been refused in Canada. After they're rejected, there's a conditional deportation order. After 30 days, if they haven't left. The legalities start to remove them. There can be **Humanitarian and Compassionate Relief** at the discretion of the decision maker. They'd look at what's in the best interests of children, at the hardships. **Citizenship** – you are eligible if over 18, have permanent residence and are physically present in Canada. **Carolyn thanked Nicole and shared that our thank you to presenters is a donation in their**
