**The Rose Manor Evening. Ann** - It looks like everyone who has signed up is here today. **Crossley Christmas Families**. 9 am on Tuesday is pickup time for delivering to Salvation Army who is organising the distribution. They're looking for non-perishable items for families.

**Guest Speaker today is Jeanette Dempster. She was the speaker at the Town's Volunteer Recognition evening. Frank is doing the introduction.** Jeanette was a psychiatric nurse with Judy. Life has thrown many challenges to Jeanette and Jeanette has risen to meet them.

Presentation. Jeanette thanked Rotary for what we're doing as a club and for inviting her here to speak. In 1994, Jeanette experienced cardiac arrest sliding into home base at a ball game. There was a defibrillator at the park and 2 more in the ambulance that just happened to be across the street from the. She called it 'sudden death syndrome.' Jeanette was on a number of medications and didn't like it. An ICD was sent into her heart – if arrhythmia occurs, it gives you a shock. 'Think positive for yourself and people around you. Help them help you!' She has 4 scars from her life saving device. One day, shocks came upon her: 31 shocks came while she was trying to figure out what was happening. That's a lot! Things that help: formal writing, gratefulness – Jeanette thinks of three things that she's grateful for at the end of the day - a spiritual life to take care of yourself. She recommends a book – Full Catastrophe.

Jeanette met other heart transplant people at a summer's meet as well as a Women and Heart Health group. Women were under supported in Heart Health. For instance, catheters were too large to fir. That has changed now but still, every 20 minutes a woman dies from heart disease. Jeanette became active in swimming through Heart Health. Her first big one was in Ottawa where she won 4 golf medals – she mentioned, smiling, that she was the only one in her age group!

**Increased awareness came about organ donation** that started when a friend donated 6 organs that help- ed 6 different people!

Swimming honours Donor, honours God. It's relaxing and a great way of staying healthy.

Do you know the ID of a Donor? Sex? Age? Cause of death? You CAN. There's a bit of curiosity. In October 2013 Jeanette was found to have breast cancer – no lymph nodes. At the same time, she was experiencing increasing symptoms of a degrading heart. One day as she was on Oxygen, the doctor said 'you know, Jeanette, not everyone makes it to transplant.' Jeanette had to wait 5 years before her cancer was <u>not</u> there anymore- the test for eligibility! That test is like being interviewed for NASA! **Jeanette is hoping to get to the World Games in Dresden**.

What keeps you going? I can rise above it. You have to look after yourself!

**Paul** – In the very beginning, were there any symptoms?

Jeanette – The US is making waves in our waves. The heart of this community comes Dec. 15, 16, and 17. Whatever is donated those days is doubled.

Thank you, Jeanette, for sharing your tough but joyful and inspiring journey!
