Welcome also to Gavin Middleton, new teacher in the Grade 12 Business Class. **Goals**. We partner with Crossley because they're looking for real live project = they're great at sales calls. They go to schools and get kids excited about going.

Bob. When we originally started FunFest, it was to have a family event and not generate money. We'd cover the cost and a bit more would be fine.

Beneficiaries Hugh. Showcase for exhibitors. It gives Rotary a showcase too. **Paul**. What can those showcasing get if lots of activities? We were trying to get organisations to come in to promote themselves.

Gail. This is farming area – fruits, dairy, farms p get them in.

Paul. Are farm kids going to want to come?

Troy. Speaking for my 2 girls, yes.

Janet. Are there animals there? Richard. No. We have Maple Syrup but it won't be in season.

Mike Concerned the bells and whistles from Bissell's may not be enough to go.

Michael. My niece really liked the unicorns. I have an idea. Why not have face painting with Rotaract? It'd involve them more and have a spot for the kids.

Ann. We have to make sure we have a draw there. We have a lot of farm people and many who aren't. We'd want as many of the animals as we can – listen to the kids.

Paul. We want them to come back! Money is not the goal but we want to make some. Last time we had \$14,000. We netted \$17,000 between this and tickets.

Bob The hook is the farm. Many town kids have never been to a far,/ How about Alpacas, etc., a petting zoo on the farm? It could work for the town kids? And the new people in Community. An Obstacle course? Moving from one to another?

Troy What about a Passport like in the past?

Carolyn. I'm asking Richard who comes now. **Richard**. Many children. We've done playing in the barn, the Cancer Ride. Head for the Hills.

Gavin. I'm taking a few notes.

Paul. If we're raising money, do we tie it to some specific group?

Dave. Ann mentioned a number of youth groups. **Mel** It's an important question to bring back to Crossley for the kids to choose – give them a list.

Carolyn. Sustainable environment & food stability – our Rural Roots.

Paul/Gavin. We need to assess the kids; ability,

Frank. Maybe involve trees.

Paul. Marketing. Printing at Crossley is a great deal. There's no money from Crossley for this. We could have Rotary pay. We probably saved a couple of \$1000 by going through Crossley.

Richard We do a lot of printing at the farm.

Signage. We need you Dave. **School visit** made a huge difference. **Radio** is a good tool as well.

Hugh. 30 x 30 second spots on the Radio were used in the previous year of the Auction. Country 89. Giant are good. 610 is POP. WM is willing to help. **Carolyn**. Radio will want exclusivity.

Paul. Paula Racher will be a big asset. I've talked to Rich about **The Ontario Farm Association** as sponsor. His dad had been on the Board. OFB could be great.

Paula was the community events manager for Canada Games. **Ontario Flower Growers** can bring flowers and make things out of them. **John Langendoen** might participate. **Paralympic Sports** like to demonstrate basketball. **Chain Saw Carving.**

RBC has **Olympian Truck.** It's a big presentation thing. It may not cost us anything. **Mother Earth Day** in May – Flower and Shrubs exchanges.

Great Lakes Clean Up / Sheep Shearing /Wagon Ride 20 minutes back and forth. Perhaps one of the exhibitors could be in the forest too. / Birdhouse Building - Home Depot would provide the building. We would have to have pre-registration / Large Farm Equipment the bigger the better / Antique Farm Equipment with steam / Hayride / 12 Fire Departments in the area. A TUG OF WAR! Get EMS involved. Have the Tug of War early in the morning /PARKING White Meadows has 180 car spots and could probably accommodate 500 cars. We *could* split morning and afternoon. / Mel mentioned that at Ball's Falls they had the OWL Foundation and kids were engaged./ Ball's Falls had a Blacksmith / Birds of Prey from Stevensville
