7. Introduction of today's Speaker. Hugh introduced Colleen Smith, Presenter and Diana McAdorey of the Performance Arts Centre.

Colleen Smith is a Canadian arts leader, musician, producer and educator with expertise that spans strategic and financial planning, organizational development, program development and change management. With national and international executive leadership experience, she has led teams at Theatre Calgary, one of Western Canada's largest producing theatres; served as project director for Phase 1 of the Massey Hall Capital Revitalization Project; and in 2019 served as co-lead on the Arts, Culture and Digital Transformation Summit at the Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity. An MBA graduate from the Schulich School of Business, Smith most recently worked with Newfoundland's Gros Morne Summer Music in designing and implementing a national rollout strategy that resulted in the successful development of partnerships with the Aga Khan Museum, Humber College School for the Creative and Performing Arts and the Banff Centre.

Proudly identifying Prince Edward Island as 'home', she is humbled and inspired by the many communities across the country that she has been privileged to work with and work for, and actively gives back to those communities through volunteer service with other non-profit organizations and mentorship programs. Often drawing from her early years as a high school music and drama teacher in Halifax Nova Scotia, she loves nothing more than providing and supporting the development of diversified and enriched arts education experiences for all youth, without exception.

Since March 2020 Colleen has permanently relocated to the Niagara Region and proudly represents the FirstOntario Performing Arts Centre as CEO.

Diana McAdorey also works with PAC, Diana McAdorey was born and raised in the Niagara Region however **began her career in Toronto as the Executive Director of the Toronto School of Art, a post-secondary visual arts school**. In addition to working at both performing and visual arts schools, she also led the Business Development Arm of the Ontario Municipal Social Services Association in Mississauga, and **most recently spent 14 years as the Executive Director of Chorus Niagara.** She completed an Honours Bachelor of Commerce at McMaster University and an MBA at York University, specializing in Arts and Media Management.

Her father was a professional visual artist, and Diana also enjoys painting. Her children are both musicians – a guitarist (classical, acoustic, and electric) and a drummer.

She has been with the FirstOntario Performing Arts Centre since November.

8. Presentation: Colleen Smith, Performance Arts Centre.

With four state-of-the-art performance venues — Partridge Hall, Robertson Theatre, Recital Hall and The Film House — the centre has been a key driver of the City's ongoing effort to spark a cultural renaissance in the community. The Film house itself is the only PAC in Canda that runs all year. It's important to serve ALL of Niagara! The PAC opened in 2018 with Brock University and all the municipalities participating in running it. There is a Board of Directors and Colleen reports to them. The City of St Catharines provides 29% of the budget and the rest is through activities. What kinds of activities do we present? Education for the young, Community screening, Sharing Dance for seniors, Celebration of Nations — every September, Supporting local art and expecting 10000 coming through on Family Day. We have 8 performances that fill up our 800 seats in Partridge Hall and bring in speakers, dancers for \$10 each! We have Youth Film Clubs, 14 High School Students talk about what's relevant and we bring in films to represent these issues. Brock Music Program performs and the French schools and other educational places take advantage. In 2023-24, 80 Schools have registered. 128 schools since the beginning and over 2000 supervisors.
