6. **Presidents Report, Correspondence and Announcements. Ann. Fees.** \$128 dollars goes to the Foundation. Only \$59 stays with the club. That's why we do ask for our dues in a timely fashion. We still have a number of members needing to pay.

Canada Games August 6-21. There will be a Beer Tent at Brock University. All Rotary clubs will have volunteers. Our club does pay for the Smart Serve course for any who would like to help out here (Summerfest, etc.) A portion will come back to the Clubs volunteering.

Mentoring a student for Peace Scholarship. If you'd like to be involved, connect with Ann for meeting with student later on.

Arches. They're moving along. No pavers will be happening. Too expensive.

Hybrid meetings. March 2 is next meeting. Bring Your Own Coffee and Breakfast until it's viable for Tim. Ann will let MCC know we'll be back. Dave will bring the USB for set up. **Paul Snack. TR Adams**is presented annually to a member of the community who has shown that volunteerism is a part of her or his life – if you have someone in mind, Ann is sending out the presentation and will include the ask.

7. Presentation and Discussion – District Grant Applications /Rotary Foundation District Grants. We have

3 potential matching grant opportunities. We submit an application in the spring for fall. It has to fit in with our **Areas of Focus.** Maximum grant includes \$2000US from the District so we'll have about \$5000. Our funding for this? Every dollar donated to the Annual Fund comes back, half to Global and half to the district. It includes active participation of Rotarians. The applications will be reviewed and approved. Restrictions? We can't promote religious or political view points; we can't fund land or building purchases. We have 3 groups applying. April 30 is the deadline. The District Foundation Committee reviews and approves it. The Club funds the full cost, then reports at end of project and gets one half of the grant (\$2500) back into our budget.

Applicants. Tyler Graham Outdoor Amphitheatre at Crossley. Students would design it themselves. The focus would be the Band and Drama students, teaching and performance. There would be a Pollinator garden. The estimated budget is \$5000. **Hotel Dieu Shaver.** Their application is to cover one of three purchases: **Sara Stedy Lift**-\$3800, **Medication Cart** -\$3900, or **Hi-Lo Mat Platform** - \$4400. **NPAAMB's** application is to cover 4 Youth Led Workshops. Its target is youth in community. **1**. Beaded

Poppies. 2. Indigenous Dream Making. 3. Indigenous Walking Stick. 4. Medicine Walk. \$5000 Ann will send it out.

Keith. Last summer we applied for support for Youth Indigenous Program – IG Wealth is funding it. Perhaps there can be something done with the NPAAMB.

Hugh. Does the building of the Amphitheatre fall into guidelines? Ann. Yes.

Paul. Could we make our FunFest \$\$ go toward the Amphitheatre because of their work? **Ann.** That's part of our operating budget.

Hugh. Have to be careful with our fundraising going to operating budget. **Ann.** I'll include all our comments.

Lance. \$5000 seems light. Do they have other sources? Ann. There are other sources as well. Carolyn. Crossley - would horticulture students be involved? Ann. Yes. Carolyn. What's the story? Annie. Speaking up for the 'indigenous proposal.'

Dave. We should reserve judgment for the indigenous project.

Ann. Without presidential hat, I think it's appropriate to help Crossley given their assistance to Family FunFest.

Carolyn. What's Rotary's involvement piece? The networking is great. What's Rotary's involvement in these projects?

Hugh. There's got to be an opportunity for youth leading the workshops. Rotary connection could be monitoring with Rotaract - a way to meld community and Rotary going forward.

Lance. Awesome to use Amphitheatre next year!

Frank. 2 years ago, we did Socks for Change and another project in the same year. We could do that again. There's the possibility to look at this again this year.

Ann. Will send out PowerPoint today. Will copy Troy on all of this. **Troy.** What's the due date? **Ann**. We have March and April to work on it.
