Guest Presentation: Niagara Nutrition Program, Lisa Davis, Kindergarten teacher at St Ann’s, Fenwick, and her Volunteers
Presentation: Lisa Davis, Kindergarten teacher at St Ann's, Fenwick, and her Volunteers Sam, Stephan, Leon and Ben.
First, without her wonderful and dedicated volunteers, Lisa says it would be impossible to achieve what they have done at St Ann's. I've been doing this for 9 years at St Ann's and 10 years prior in Welland. Paul Mocha, who is with us today, is our supportive principal. With him are our wonderful parent volunteers and their sons who have accompanied me today and will be helping with presentation. Lisa started the program with parent volunteers serving breakfast until Covid. Now, the boys come to the breakfast room, choose food to deliver and bring it to every classroom. Each box has cooling packs in it. They go back at the end of the day to pick up and then refrigerate whatever hasn't been opened for the next day.
The food is 'peanut and nut' free. With the $\$ 1000$ Rotary cheque that Ann brought to the school we were able to purchase three months of food. It's an ongoing need. We have a 50-60\% need and some days $70 \%$ of the food is accessed. There's a big need. All kids eat a lot!
What's the overall cost? \$4000. Sobeys is a great donor giving \$2000 annually in gift cards. We have 135 kids in school. We order a lot from Lococo's including baby carrots, yogurt tubes and boiled eggs that are packaged 1 apiece.
How do you ID kids? Someone identifies them and puts in a form for each of them.
Why do you do it (question to the boys - Sam, Stephan, Leon and Ben) It's fun; I want to help; I enjoy it.

Lisa. It's a big commitment and I couldn't do it without their help. Every month I have to state financials. If you have surplus at end of school year, you start all over again in September. Food has to have nutritional content, e.g. granola bars and they disappear really fast!
Hugh. Thanked the parents for such fine young men.
Principal Mocha thanked Lisa and the boys for such a successful program.
Paul invited them all to the skate on Family Day.
Troy. Many thanks - Our Club holds literacy close and to thank our presenters, we make a donation to the Lincoln-Pelham Public Library in their names. I'd like to encourage the three going to EL Crossley to check out Interact - it's the high school equivalent of Rotary that Rotary sponsors and would allow your great volunteering to easily continue.
