Paul Harris Presentations. Frank is presenting an award for a Citizen and for a Rotarian. Rotarian Michael Jacques has changed the lives of many. Frank had invited Michael to speak at his District Conference that had a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Theme. Michael has an invisible disability. It's clear life is not fair. With hard work, he can overcome most obstacles. Michael is an annual guest lecturer of the Ontario Police College. Ontario's Community Living Group is there to advocate for people with experiences of Michael. The point is that everyone belongs. Community Living Ontario is a nonprofit advocacy group for individuals with disabilities. Michael was nominated as a representative from Pelham. He then became President and is now Chair. He's also on the Minter's Advisory Council on Special Education. Michael is the only one there WITH a disability and does well. The Ontario Lieutenant Governor met with Michael. The Federal Government recommended Michael to the Queen's Trust, an advocate for young people. There are presently 39 Canadian members. Michael has met with the senior executives of Sobeys where he's been working since 2007. He was named Citizen of the Year by the Kinsmen in 2014.

Michael Thanks, I only do it to make things better.

Frank. And now I'd like to call up Marcel Jacques to become a Paul Harris Fellow in appreciation for EVERYTHING you've done for your son. Your support has allowed many doors to open for Michael. I believe he calls you his Executive Assistant.

Marcel. In the last 4, 5 years, Michael has done over 400 presentations across Canada and into the United States. He does a podcast every week with 80,000 followers from the US and South America, He talks and shares his story. In the last 3 weeks, Michael has gone to Brock and spoken to every new teacher. University of Western Ontario has asked Michael come for a keynote speaker on invisible disabilities. It's been my pleasure to support and be there to ensure he can reach as many as possible. This has included being the 'driver.'

Frank. Both Michael and Marcel have the heart for Service above Self.
