7. Introduction of today's Speaker. Ann Harrison introduced Irene Newton, born Irene Shumylo.

She came to Canada in 1952 at the age of one and lived in St. Catharines all her life. Irene grew up in the Ukrainian community, sang in Ukrainian choirs, danced in a Ukrainian dance group and belonged to the Ukrainian Youth Association. She is married to Ron Newton, with 2 children and 2 step-children and now has 7 grandchildren.

After retiring from teaching in the public elementary system for 35 years, the last 6 years as a school principal, and working with the teacher's union on negotiating team, Irene managed the Ukrainian Black Sea Hall Cultural and Banquet Centre for 5 years. She volunteered with both the Ukrainian church and the Ukrainian Canadian Congress in St. Catharines.

Currently she is President of the Ukrainian Catholic Women's League at Sts. Cyril and Methodius Church, and has been President of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress-Niagara Region Branch for the last 10 years, as well as Vice-President of the UCC Ontario Provincial Council, and Vice-President of the League of Ukrainian Women in Canada-St. Catharines branch.

She also serves on the Niagara District Council of Women (strangely not Ukrainian).

Right now their efforts are all coordinated to help the Ukrainian people.

Presentation by Irene. Irene reminded us that this February 2024 marks 2 years of Ukraine's war with Russia and that the local UKRAINIANS and outer community haven't stopped helping, including Government, and continue to support. The first Rally in 2023 in Niagara Falls was asking for financial support. Putin's goal is to absorb Ukraine into Russia and get the other eastern countries back into Russia, 'We've' done everything we can to protest those eastern countries. The fear now is war fatigue. There is more conflict elsewhere and Russia is involved. St John's Ukrainian Church os now sending drones. Last year we sent generators, warm clothing. All through people helping – all volunteers. We help send things. There's a registered Niagara Ukraine Fund. It started with donations from a Doctor that gave us the means, through his will, to help Ukraine people in this area. Highest need is rent. Irene says to new arrivals that she'll try and get them a place, furniture, clothing. We've made arrangements with furniture companies. We're still doing all this work. Ron is so helpful.

St John's Church is our biggest support. 5000 cargo packages have been sent to Ukraine, first through air to Poland, and then trucked into Ukraine. We hold rallies, candlelight ones for mothers, soldiers on the Front. Casa Dante has done fundraising as has the Vietnamese

community and the Philippian community. It's very heartwarming but it looks bleak – it's two years now. We can't let it go.

Any questions?

Bob. Has the flow of people out of Ukraine slowed? **Irene**. A bit but not a lot. Jobs are good in the tourist season. Most are coming from eastern Ukraine. Lots of children. All sign up at the food bank.

Frank. How many families? **Irene**. Well over 500. There are a lot of asylum seekers from Chile, Mexico, Haiti, Syria, and Pakistan. I work with great companies who will take them on.

Paul. What are your immediate needs? **Irene**. RENT! At Christmas we bought 1000's of Gift Cards for Walmart, Food Basics, and No Frills. Through Amazon, WE were gifted \$25,000 of gift cards to be distributed to families at Christmas. We've also been getting deals on mattresses, furniture.

Mel. Do you have storage? If a house is being cleared out? **Irene**. No Warehouse.

Lance. Question about ESL. **Irene.** No. At beginning it was easier. Now more people need it so longer line ups. It's harder to get in and takes a 3-4 months' wait. There are daytime and evening classes. Evening classes are for workers.

Ann. Do you help them get into the schools? Irene. Yes, we connect with secondary schools with ESL.

Collins. Did you work with government agencies? **Irene**. We work with Multicultural Centres, and the Niagara Refugee Organisations. There are no direct links with government. Ukrainians are not refugees – they don't get status. They receive \$3000 per adult and \$1500 per child and that's it. They do receive OHIP plus a SIN number plus a work permit through government. We know who our partners are locally. Long term drivers from Ukraine have to do driving tests. It's not a government organisation, it's a 'money grab.' Every province is different.

Carolyn. Thank you, Irene, for this update on the work you're doing. It's all vital! We have on line applications and one came through from the Canadian Ukraine Congress. We awarded them \$1500 and would like to present that cheque to Irene now.

Also, in honour of you speaking today Irene, we make a donation in your honour to Pelham Cares for their New Comer Program.
