They asked the right questions and got good info in return. **The new Mission statement is Lincoln Pelham Public Library builds connections.** With their Vision, they wanted to be sure their plan supported the two towns with Inspiration, Resilience, and Responsiveness. The central theme s 'Libraries: Place We Belong. Service – Connecting people to services. 'Reconciliation'

We renovated our now Book Mobile or 'Branch on Wheels.'
