6. President's Report/Correspondence/Announcements:

7. Speaker: Diana Huson – Regional Councilor

Introduction: Mel. Mel met Diana 15 years ago. Through those years, she's seen her do great things with great vision. Diana has a Master's in Political Science and then an MBA in marketing to which she's also brought her passion for the Environment. 2 years into her course, there was a suggestion that she run for our Pelham seat at District Council. The rest is 'herstory.'

Speaker, Diana Huson – Regional Councilor. Thanks for inviting me to speak about the environmental work over the past two years on Council. I'm presently Chair of Planning and Economic Development Committee and Vice Chair of Niagara Peninsula Conservation Authority. The NPCA has a strategic Environmental Plan, a 10 year strategic plan that started in July 2020and is being developed. The plan was drafted. You can take a look at GetInvolved.npca.ca – you can still provide some feedback. There was record attendance at the Parks and Trails meeting over Spring 2021 that showed how important it is about the Wainfleet Wetlands. 70 acres of land on Morgan Point Road will have Environmental Conservation and significant woodland. https://npca.ca/newsroom/article/npca-purchases-70-acres-of-environmentally-significant-public-greenspace



The Conservation authority has a restoration project that different landowners can appy for.

Pelham has 4.5 hectares for tree planting. There are another 3500 plants to fo in and we're expecting to see more of an uptake. Glendale Eco-Park is a proposed 172 acres with development of trails, active transportation opportunities – they're currently exploring acquisition lands over by the N-O-T-L Outlet Mall.

The Official Plan National Heritage sees a 250,000 growth in population. They've been updating the plan and it's up to us how they choose to adapt to it. Modeling data and forecasting and the greening initiative is part of their/our response to Climate Change. Plan includes mapping of the Region's National Heritage features and water resources. The tree canopy needs to be replanted. 7400 tress have been planted at Decew Water Treatment Plant based on one of my emails in 2019. It may be an opportunity for municipalities to look at green space they'd like to make greener. Paul. How does Niagara's philosophy include housing development which impacts us here? Diana. It goes to our official plan. We ID natural areas we want to serve and protect. Other development takes place outside of them. We need to keep our watershed protected. Paul. What's the Ontario Caucus Federation of Canadian Municipalities? Diana. Jim Bradley asked Diana if she'd be interested in running for that board and she said YES! Lance. This area is unique with tender fruit – it's hard for farmers to resist selling to developers. **Diana**. As part of Plan, areas of agriculture aren't developable. It's not an option for farmers to sell to developers. We have had to say no. That's why we're trying to focus development in urban areas. A new water treatment plant will help with development and keep elsewhere pristine. Hugh. Our first project was tree planting in North Pelham. Diana. Reach out to Trout Industries if you'd like to volunteer to plant trees at any time.
