6. Presidents Report, Correspondence and Announcements. Troy

Welland Paul Harris evening is May 10th. They are also doing a Purse Bingo that month.

7. Guest Speakers. Welcome Father Paul MacNeil and Paula Guest, Parishioner, St Alexander Church

Father Paul. Congratulations on your Purse Bingo. One of our parishioners noted that the proceeds went to the Breakfast Programs of 6 schools including St Alexander's. Wonderful! The St Vincent de Paul Society is there to help the poor. Here in Pelham, there are food programs for adults. There's definitely an issue with loneliness. If we could give them something to get people out of their rut, that would be good. We have 55 people signed up for scheduling their help. They're getting to know each other and want to give back to Pelham — to be a leader in that we can be a good neighbour. Our effort is still very new. Pelham Today wrote a beautiful article.

Paula. This is a very humble outreach. It's multi-pronged. We're aware of food insecurity. We'll do it till end of June and then reassess.

Father Paul. There's a simple way to happiness – extend humanity through coffee. Our community wants to be part of a larger community. Our volunteers are excited, motivated and happy. The Anglican Church in Welland has 50 + a day. We've had 2 here, 2 there, other visitors. We need to be persistent, maybe say 'free breakfast.' There are a lot of variables – mobility and weather for two. **Paula**. We're not concerned with numbers.

Father Paul. We don't want to get attached to the outcome. We'll serve coffee after mass. Serve the needs and our community has changed.

Question. What's the point of contact?

Paula. The Parish office. Our website.

Father Paul. The World Day of Prayer was on Friday and I was hoping to be there. (Paula went).

The Legion feeds 65. Pelham Care makes 70 meals a week;

It's very intentional to invite people in. They can stay or do take out. Some volunteers have offered to deliver meals. We open at 830 am.

Dave. Rotary can plug it through our social media.

Father Paul/Paula. We're hopeful but cautious.

Bob, There's a fellow convict that's out again and will be back inside. This person needs a big brother/father so he stays OUT of jail. There are lots of these out there. People don't feel safe anymore. **Hugh.** Our church does the same in Welland. It's not as prevalent with street people in Fonthill. It never fails – people who are participants are very grateful and appreciative. It's wonderful you got 44 volunteers. Our church does it on Thursday mornings. In December, every day was offering breakfast. **Paula.** It's a tradition that the church does outreach. Many churches do lunch at the Hope Centre. Troy. As a thank you for coming today, we make a donation to the Lincoln Pelham Library on your behalf. Food and its security are a bigger issue and continue to grow. Thank You for what you are doing.
