#### 7. Upcoming Spring Events and News Items

**District Grants: Mel** spoke on status of **District Grants.** We've received the \$1900US to pay for the desks and chairs for Women's Place. It's great that it's closed! We're moving on to **Crossley Amphitheatre**. Kevin McConkey received a grant via his business. Did we receive the letter to Shaver? **Ann.** We can talk about it later.

**TV Auction update: Ann** had the final results of the TV Auction. \$17, 267 included \$3200 in cash donations. Annie added that our share of the expenses, based on per capita, was \$917 making the total \$16,350.

**April Home Show: Setup.** Set Up is needed for Friday. We have Saturday and Sunday volunteers but need more. **Dave.** Sunday is not filled/ Please check for Sunday openings especially.

**Earth Week Clean-up: Ann.** Weekend of April 23<sup>rd</sup> – Area Clean-up that we can connect with the Great Lakes Watershed Clean-Up. We won't be having a meeting that week so we can all work on the Clean-up that weekend. **Frank.** That Saturday is for town clean-up. We can select an area – Steve Bauer Trail for instance. DG Anne Bermingham wants to see us ask others out at that time – let Dave know. **Ann.** We could take one area – any of the areas MMC and Rice Road because of construction debris – even meeting there and heading out along watershed on April 23, 10 am at MCC. **Ann** will let town know and we can leave bags and items by the road for pick up. Wear your rain boots as it'll be pretty wet. \$3 at the dollar store for 'picker uppers'!

**Great Lakes Watershed Clean-up.** The above town clean-up can count toward the Great Lake Clean-up **Butterfly garden at Wellspring. Ann asking Troy.** Is there anything we can do for the Butterfly Garden? **Troy** is looking into it this weekend to see how things fared over the winter. We'll need planting, clean-ups, signage – what Butterfly Project is and acknowledging the Rotary connection. **NB** Don't clean up dead leaves as pollinations can still take place.

**June Family Funfest. Ann.** We've received \$2,000 for Family FunFest from Crossley. Students are also doing a collection for Ukraine via the Rotary Foundation Disaster Fund for Ukraine.

**Canada Day. Lance.** Update from the City meeting. June 21-July 1<sup>st</sup> will see Indigenous activities if the money comes in. Bouncers have been ordered and they are honouring our credit. New this year is an axe throwing contest – Styrofoam axes! Sandastic will be happening again. Volunteers are always a challenge. Lance is going to see if Crossley needs volunteer hours. July 1<sup>st</sup> is a Friday. We do need adults for the bouncers. \$5Million insurance is covered by Niagara Inflatables and that's OK with the town. There's another meeting on March 30<sup>th</sup>. We're progressing with the time frames. Ann. Janet Cripps is our contact for the hours. Grade 8

S can start after grad but aren't available for FunFest. Just for Canada Day. We need 2 shifts – 1-330 and 330-6.

**FunFest Updates. Paul S.** Crossley kids and class moving ahead, reaching out to sponsors, etc. In the next few weeks, we'll be getting out more including a Save the Date to go out on social media.

**Torch Relay, Canada Games. Frank.** Our part of the Torch Run is Saturday of **Summerfest,** July 16. Hopefully, we'll get a lot out – we need 10-15 Rotary volunteers to man the exchange spots. It'll take 15 minutes max. We'll post the times the runners will be coming through on the 16<sup>th</sup>. The other torch run is **Port Colborne's**. The hoped for \$30,000 grant didn't come in so we're beating the bushes again. The money has been paid for the down payment for manufacture of steel arches. We still need to raise another \$30,000
