I experienced Christmas and Halloween and the different traditions from home. I met a lot of different people, Rotarians and other students. Over the seven months I learned about myself and learned to 'never give up.' I wish I can visit again soon.

When I went home to Belgium, it was difficult as it was in March. It was odd for me meeting friends and family as I'd just left my Canadian families. I couldn't go to school. I took a lot of courses. I took my driving lessons and passed them! Now I'm studying English, Dutch and Spanish.

My PowerPoint presentation shows all the many things I did, that I experienced with my friends and families, my school and within Rotary.

WOW! What a great PowerPoint presentation – a kaleidoscope of experiences with friends at school, with the other YE students, with Rotarians and families. Fanny's soundtrack added another dimension of emotion.
