Games and simulators – great for kids! Zavcor Truck, Zabbix Tractor Driver Training simulator. Kids will get a chance to try out. **Barbeque.** 4H is doing a Barbeque. They have a new truck and grill. They make excellent milk shakes. Mike Chechak is making it happen with all his connections. West Niagara Organisation is going to lend fencing. Tons of help is coming to us through Mike. His wife is a reporter for Farm Monthly. **Regional Water Truck.** 500 storage bottles at Wellspring. Could we access some of them? You need to bring your own. **Niagara Police** coming. They're pushing to get the ATVs. **PITA** This group is against farm animals being used and could show up.

Promotion Dave puts up our promotion. Giant FM, Country 89 – a whole whack of PSAs are running the week before. 25,000 people got an e blast! Signage is supposed to be ready for tomorrow.
