7. Today's Presentation – Sharon introduced our speaker. There are 4 pillars for the NPCA – 1. Plant more trees. 2. Create more access. 3. Support education. And 4, create more protected spaces. Niagara Region has the 2 Great Lakes, the Fonthill Kame, Niagara Falls. Eric Baldwin came in 2022 with a Masters of Environmental Studies. Eric. This is an informal

presentation so interrupt if you have questions. I'm working with the Land Securement Program. This is a map of our watershed. Ottawa to Windsor, Sault Ste Marie and Sudbury. We manage what's in their watershed. It's so unique but brings challenges. We have 43 properties including Ball's Falls in and around its watershed. The Land Securement Strategy is a strategic document to fall back on.

Our 2024 success Stories. In 2 years, we've secured 180 hectares. Our target was 180 hectares by 2032. Less than 1% of our taxes go to NPCA! \$4.25 M from municipal taxes. In our Box 30 program, almost all Indigenous peoples signed up to conserve. There are now almost 1900 hectares in that program.

We have to focus our efforts. I want !SOHA in 10 years. There's a list of features they go after! It's important to have good story areas – like the Wetlands! We don't have enough resources to manage them even IF we could get them.

NPCA Securement Strategy is focused around key properties Including the northeast portion town of Pelham

Frank What's the relationship between agriculture and NCPA? **Eric** The Land Trusts at a National level. There are some local trusts as well depending on locale and features. We do a ton of fundraising to make it work. Lots of leads I get come from meetings like this. It's the equivalent of neighbourhood sales, etc. **Land Securement** can come from donations, a spontaneous receipt, a bequest. It can also come as an ecological gift. If an owner has land, s/he can donate all or part of it. You can write it off over 10 years. Capital Gains is there when you sell that portion but you can write it off too. **Bequest** in estate planning can be capital, cash, and the house.

Projects are shovel ready. The Feds can give money with short timelines. For instance, \$3Million and 3 parcels available. Half to the Feds and half to NPCA. Rotary Groups, etc., ID properties, etc. Recreationally, there's Long Beach, Chippawa Falls and Balls Falls. Feds say we have to generate funds. We could do it by expanding Long Beach camping for instance. Planned giving and Annual Gifts are another source. There could be targeted property in the area. You can have campaigns. All properties have restorative projects. Trees 4 All is another route.

Invasive Species. We already have them and they're still coming! It's another focus we have.

Paul. Land Development. Do you need approval from NPCA? **Eric** Yes, not the final say but we do have a say. Doing research on any property you want to buy is a good idea. If you have 50 acres and can't take care of it all, or perhaps 48 of the 50 is wetland – NPCA can acquire without severing.
