7. Guest Speaker – Cesar Rafael Maldonado Mercado – Sustainability and Mobility as a Service – https://portal.clubrunner.ca/289/Documents/en-ca/6d80280c-15f8-4679-8422-4cf573c497ee/1/ introduced by Maria del Carmen Suescun Pozas – Cesar is finally back in Canada after 4 years away. Years ago he was trained in Civil Engineering in Mexico at the University of Mexico. When he was in Canada, in Niagara, he was active in environmental issues. During these past two years of Covid, Cesar has focused on projects needing both sustainability and mobility.

Cesar. A few tidbits from his attached presentation. The project in Mexico City was one of Mobility through 'Ropeways.' 40,000-75,000 people are moved per day. Cesar got to go and inspect factories that made the different elements starting with Austria in 2019. He had many travels and contact with others which lead to seeing how to predict problems, how important it was to have community manager. It was not only about engineering but also collaboration with authority and community. When there was the collapse of an overpass ion May 3, 2021, there was no compliance with the project's plans. He started to work on the problem – checking quality of the concrete, the preparation needed. Cesar took an online course on risk reduction from South Korea. He presented a plan to the Ministry including training for workers to report on *their* observations.

Cesar adding a few more tidbits and note to club members! The Covid-19 pandemic provided me the opportunity to work in Mexico in construction projects, and remotely with Dawson College and John Abbott College in The Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS) certification process. For the past three years I had the opportunity to promote and implement quality and sustainability standards in Mexico, Colombia and Canada. I collaborated with the Ministry of Public Works Of Mexico City in the main mobility projects.

I would like to highlight the ropeway projects Cablebús L-1, and Cablebús L-2 that was awarded with the Guinness record as the longest public transit line in the world. In my quality auditor role, I assessed quality plans in 10 factories in 4 countries, and visited 15 ropeways lines in 5 countries.

As external consultant I facilitated the application for STARS certification of Dawson College <u>STARS Gold</u> <u>Rating –Rank # 1 Associate Colleges</u> in 40 countries. I also collaborated with John Abbott College assessing sustainability content in Courses and Programs.

Unfortunately, along with casualties in the staff due to the pandemic and overpass of underground L-12 collapsed on May 3th, 2021.

My presentation for Fonthill Rotary Club represents the opportunity to reconnect with members of our communities as well with friends. During my journey in Portugal I visited Cabo da Roca, and found the Rotary Plaque that brought me good memories from past years and confirmed that Rotary Club works all over the

world.

Finally, I would like to thank all Rotary members that attended to my presentation last week. I look forward to collaborate in future activities. Regards, Cesar
