- 7. Other Information Items

a. Canada Games Torch Relay – Paul S

Each Community will have its own organizing committee for their Torch Relay. The first meeting for Pelham will be Nov 25. Paul and Frank are representing our club on this committee and the main Canada Games organizing committee. Paul and Frank are looking at ways to incorporate fundraising into the Torch Relay. They will have more to report next week. They will need volunteers for the relay and the main organizing committee needs volunteers also. Frank is asking that we help support Port Colborne as they do not have a Rotary Club. Rotaract will be organizing a Torch Relay in Thorold. The committee had considered organizing a second event promoting Niagara in conjunction with the games, but decided that it would be too much given all that is already going on. They will be looking at 2023 for a fundraiser promoting Niagara.

b. **Purse Bingo** – Mel

The Purse Bingo is on hold for the time-being because we cannot rent the Accursi Room until the vaccine program is completed. The Town of Pelham has approved the use of the funds from the last Purse Bingo be redirected to the project purchasing desks and chairs for Women's Place of South Niagara as part of the District Grant.

c. **District Grants** – Mel

The current 2021-22 project is the purchase of 20 desks and chairs for Women's Place. They have been purchased and are in storage pending the opening of the new location in Niagara Falls. We will be invited to an event when the location is ready.

Applications for the 2022-23 grant cycle are due in March 2022. Once again this will involve \$2,500 from

the club to be matched by the District for a total of \$5,000. The committee is requesting ideas for potential projects that would involve an Indigenous and/or Environmental theme.

d. **Arches Update** – Frank

The delayed project has been affected by inflation and the most recent budget estimate is \$160K for 3 sets of arches rather than the originally planned 4 arches. We have approximately \$100K in contributions raised.

Summerfest has been confirmed for 2022 and the hope was to have the arches in place by then. Summerfest Chair has resigned and has also withdrawn from the Arches Project.

Next Presentation to Council – December

Donors remain committed to the project. There was discussion around having a contingency project ready in case the Arches project is defeated by Council.

President Ann and others commended Frank for the immense amount of work and energy that he has devoted towards this project.

e. Youth Exchange – Meghan

Recruitment has begun for both potential Exchange Students and Host Families. The District has confirmed that Youth Exchange will be reopened for 2022-23. We will need to recruit 4 families for the year which would start in August 2022. We could proceed while keeping 2023 as a contingency should something pandemic related cause another delay. That would allow us to begin recruiting families now. An email will be sent to our members from Ann and Meghan regarding this.
