Rotary Mega TV Auction. This is our 14th year with 7 Niagara Rotary clubs who came together 14 years ago to do this auction together. We've raised \$2 Million so far. We brought in \$28,000 worth this year and whatever top bids come from our Fonthill donors' items and certificates comes back to the club. WE made 60% last year and hoping for 65% which would be \$18,200.
