6. Guest Speaker – Hugh. Introduced Ryan Harrison, President and Director of Fun and Owner of the Jackfish Baseball team.

Ryan's premise is entertainment always! Promotion through shirts, rock concerts, running the bases, etc., continues all season. The Ball Park has 2100 seats. We decided to invest in some stadium seating rather than a Christmas Party. Ryan showed a video of all the excitement fans experienced each game not to mention the Baseball! Young and old, people come from Buffalo to Burlington.

The Jackfish is the pike, native to the Welland River. It's a cool logo. 1000 came to the first game. Last year, 25,000 were there during the season at the park. We hope to increase from 1000 a game to 1500 this year. Funding: We had \$75,000 of our own money. Raffles, pick game charges (pay 12 and get back 4) brought in funds too. Welland Roses – professional ball jerseys – we auction those off. Our games are Thursday at 7 and Saturday at 1 through June, July and August. Another premise is fun for all. On **December 10**th – check out Tailgates in Welland.

Our website is wellandjackfish.com. Entry starts at \$7 a game with highest ticket price at \$14. Right now we have 639 stadium seats. If you pay, it's your seat for the season. We also have Junior Jackfish. All our rep teams are called Jackfish. We had 4 initially and now we have 8. We don't have much to do with them but have loaned our name. Our Team tied for 1st – City finals we didn't do as well! Goal is to meet the finals. Charities – **Troy** – you've given out tons! Raffles for different charities, Welland Roses – switch it around. We're tagging up with Welland firefighting. Hope, Rose City Kids – we do a package deal with Ice Dogs. **Hugh**. I'm a big fan. Jackfish put out a feeler that they were coming and we've had our seats ever since. There's a season ticket and a hoody in the Auction.

Hugh thanked Ryan and mentioned our speakers are thanked with a donation to Lincoln Pelham Library.
