#### Discussion

**MCC Pledge** We pledged \$25,000 over 5 years. We paid the first \$5000 to MCC. Because we like more project centred donations, we looked at trails and equipment. Then the opportunity to replace the arches arose and we switched the remaining \$20,000 to restoring the Arches. There is now a grant available to do the 4<sup>th</sup> arch, sails and plating. It's well north of \$250.000. We can put our \$20,000 left owing to the town for the Arches.

An ECO Park is planned and a Seniors' Centre. It's contingent on another grant. Playground equipment for us? There are a number of options.

Mike. I'd rather do the Arches and then something by ourselves.

**Frank.** We should put the \$20,000 to the Arches and then, looking ahead, something with park like trees – not a huge cost.

**Troy**. The timeline is 2026. **Paul.** We still owe \$20,000. **Troy.** We need some figures from Frank. How about some **indigenous activity?** Ask Ann. Mike would be happy to help on this.
