Introduction to Guest Speaker, Lisa Bishop. Lisa is one of our Past DGs and I've had the privilege of knowing her for many years.

Presentation. Lisa Bishop, PDG, Present Chair of District Foundation. Happy Traveller to India to Participate in the largest Polio Immunization (Drops) in the World!
Lisa. I had the privilege of knowing Karen Oakes for many years and was schooled in the love of the Foundation because of knowing her. Wolf used to take Karen everywhere she needed to be with her Foundation work, with her DG work. And now, Wolf has joined Rotary and is representing her work with the Endowment.

I was born in Oshawa and moved to Delhi in 1999. In 2009 I was sponsored by a young Rotarian who was seated beside me and invited me to join. I've hosted Youth Exchange students and been to 4 International Conventions. I'm a Flying Rotarian Club member. I'm a private pilot. I'm a governor of the East Canada '99s. I love Rotary! During the Torch Run that Frank and Paul helped organise, Anne Birmingham passed the torch to Lisa and sent a very cherished pin from Karen's year.

Oh, I have a cheque for \$1700 for the Tree Planting for your club.

Brad Howard organised this trip to India for Rotary's National Immunization Day. The date changed 3 times! **We were present and active in Delhi** for the Polio Vaccinations which were also all over India!

In 1988, Rotary International joined WHO. WE had our Polio Eradication Initiative by 2000. Thie Convery raised ½ a million dollars for Polio. Her Dundas Sunrise Club covered 20 Million cases statistically.' We made a commitment to the people of the world to eradicate Polio.' Mentors PDG Karen Oakes and Polio Eradication Champion, Rotarian Thie Convery.

As of Sunday, September 8th, there was one wild Polio Virus Case in Afghanistan. On my trip, there were 17 ½ hours on the plane. Sherry, a caregiver, made arrangements for her mother so she could go on this trip. The group went to a 'limb factory.' There was a community development around textiles. One district had 1850 members. One day at the clinic there was a fellow with an extra digit of which he was very proud. It meant he could help!

In North America, we use a shot. In India, they use drops. Each year.

We noticed at the clinic that **young men would come by** us hitting their leg. Repeatedly. It turned out that they were **showing us that they had their own limbs**, hadn't gotten Polio because of the drops they'd had earlier.

This year is the 5th year Frank is leading the Ride for **Polio**. The **Canadian Government doubled what was raised** and the **Melinda and Bill Gates Foundation doubled that!**

'The 99s' was an International Women's Pilots club. It was a 1st in this Rotary District. The 99s do humanitarian service. It was organised in 1965. They'd get together at conventions. **They sent out an invitation to all pilots** and 99 came to the 1st meeting, hence the name.

Today they mentor and promote women in aviation. On September 11, they were flying with the Lancaster over Niagara Falls. There used to be regular fly in breakfasts with Dunkirk, Fredonia and Batavia. They aren't happening any more.

I got into flying later in life but my dad got licenced at age 13. He got it in '46!
