Today's Presentation

Introduction by Paul of Introducer

I'd like to introduce a long time member of our club who is busy with lots of kids but is always with us in spirit. I was able to tug on his heart strings as he and our guest speaker, Marcel, are good friends. Join me in welcoming John Julien

Guest Speaker introduced by John

I'm a good friend of Marcel's, a good friend of Rotary's. Marcel Morgenstern is the best marketer in the Niagara Region. He has built a presence on TV. He is the father of 2 children, one of whom is in high level soccer. He's really busy with his own house and properties.

Marcel Morgenstern – Going back to the way things were is not possible.

Going back is not an option. The longer we're witnessing this it points to not going back but history shows it never does. I'm working with local wine individual with a close connect with a travel individual supplying Niagara restaurants with Niagara wines. I worked with great brands, imported products. My partner is Burnt Ship Bay Winery (great French brewer) plus sales and marketing via PondView and Bella Nova. I was asked 8 years ago why I was opening a winery. Answer: I love it and I'm going to make it work. Nothing sold in the first day. I had to do something different. I needed to share the story of its inception. People *enjoy* the stories. I was advised to focus on social media and TV and in that jut several TV channels. 8-9 years ago, winery online activity was done by an outside company to update website. Either they used high class portraits or pix on the phone. It's tough to see what it tastes like with pictures. Tell the story behind it – product is secondary. I started off with a new economic platform. Shopify integrated everything for us. It was very helpful. It was clear to me that I needed in house mediation. Today you have to control your own message. In pandemic times, there's distance but with ZOOM – new connections. I've gotten to know people better. It was an opportunity to connect faster and more directly when all went down.

QR codes popped up in early 2000. North America ignored their value. I went to China and loved the QR. WeChat over there was Facebook on steroids/ China was well prepared for QR. At a subway in China, you can by orange juice when you get off the subway by showing your QR and there is no touching during transaction. Importers introduced new products into Chine. It's done in one 'share' – 1000's of people depend on their interests. Today small businesses need to turn their companies into marketing and media companies, selling wine. Hire people to carry you the rest of the way. Take 10 minutes out of your day to learn about it. If not you, look around your staff. It was a side product of the first weeks of lockdown. During the 1st week, 70% of business disappeared because of restaurant business. A petition started on Change.org collected 10,000 signatures petitioning government to change take out services. Take out for alcohol in a few days was made legal and it still is. Very exciting! How can we support our restaurants? I Started a Facebook group sharing which restaurant did take out. WheninNiagara.com I'm sharing my screen. It was filmed on an iPhone. The graphic designer has an inexpensive program and dithe clip in half an hour. Out of the Facebook group, a true organisation marketing approach, a true directory that connects people with where they should go. Tiffany Myes works for St Catharines and does their blog. 10,000 reach within a day. Well over 1 million generated.

Paul. You've proven you're competition.

Marcel. Especially in Niagara! It's a small region. So much coming in from elsewhere – real competition. If everyone had a glass of Niagara wine once a week, we wouldn't be able to produce enough.

John. Not in purview but it's a delight to ask tough questions. I was told the easiest way to reaise money was with wine. How do you see fundraising going?

Marcel. You are the experts/ I've never understood the black tie galas. I'd rather be asked to donate \$ and get a receipt. I think money should all go to the cause. With direct sales, I can help with fundraising. It comes down to telling the story. Making the connection needs to be totally reinvented An event like Covid makes people hold onto their money. How do we get it? It's the approach.

John. Use power of the media to capture what we're looking to promote.

Marcel. Things are moving so fast. Have to be in front of people constantly.

Paul. Next comment will create discussion. I've spoken to Marcel about tying Rotary into the Canada Games food/drink event at end of Torch Run.

Andy. This is a true definition of entrepreneur. Thank you for the sire re restaurants!
