# **Program Profile - - - Teen Mentoring**

This pilot program benefits local youth two fold: it provides a mentoring opportunity for responsible youth in grades 10 to 12, and provides support to younger elementary students in grades 1 to 7 in need of a confidence boost. Selected teens are matched with elementary school children to become their "Big Buddy" for the school year and visit them at their elementary school for 1 hour each week after school. The matches are made according to shared interests and personalities. BIG THANKS to our pilot schools: James Hillier Public School matched with teens from St. Johns College, & Ryerson Heights Elementary School matched with teens from Assumption College School. BIG THANKS as well to the Aberdeen Health & Community Services Foundation who got us off the ground and started with a \$5,000 grant!



# "JumpStart" Olympic Fundraiser:

On top of ensuring top quality matches and support for both our volunteers and families, our Mentor Coordinators also help connect our "Littles" with other local supports. The Canadian Tire Jumpstart fund helps get kids off the sideline and into the game. We have had several of our "Littles" get financial help to register for sports thanks to our friends at JumpStart! During the Winter Olympics we were fortunate to help

give back and participate in the BIG fundraiser at the Simcoe Canadian Tire. The event brought in over \$30,000. Among those at the kick-off, official 2010 Olympic Torchbearer Sue Veltrie who brought the torch to our Olympic themed 2010 Bowl For Kids Sake!



### **Big Bucks @Business After Hours:**


