# **Club Holds Another Successful Group Blood Donation!**

Over 30 Rotarians, friends, and family saved almost 90 lives on Wednesday June 16 during International Blood Donor Week! Six first-time donors now know how easy and fulfilling the whole experience can be!

Under the direction of Chair Beth, the Club has now done four group donations (every 3 months) for a total of approximately 80 blood units, or donations, over the past year. That equals close to 250 lives saved from our Club alone. The group started at 9 donors and has increased steadily as new donors come back, usually after their first visit. Please contact Beth for our next event. Our group has grown to the point that **we now require two nights in September (September 14/15)** to ensure even more people can do their part, understanding that only 50% of Canadians can donate and only 4% do!!
