Pedal for Polio Raises \$500,000!!!

On October 24th, 2020 the "Participate for Polio" event took place simultaneously on both sides of the border. Canadian Rotarians rode from the Rainbow Bridge to Queenston Heights in two waves, while their American counterparts rode from Niagara Falls, N.Y. to Lewiston. Later that evening, Niagara Falls was alight with the purple for polio colours!

Two members from our club (Beth Fleeton and Elaine Richard) cycled at the event "carrying the St. Catharines Lakeshore banner". Speaking to riders and the media at the end of the rides, DG Frank Adamson said the local Rotary Clubs had already raised \$55,000 to \$60,000 by Saturday morning. But including funds raised across the river and matching funding from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, upwards of half a million dollars was raised for Rotary's End Polio Now campaign.

Congratulations Beth and Elaine - and to all the Rotarians and friends who participated and donated.

WHAT'S NEW WITH ROTARY DISTRICT 7090 AND ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

- Rotary's 2020 World Polio Day Online Global Update program on 24 October hailed this year's historic achievement in polio eradication: Africa being declared free of the wild poliovirus.
- Paralympic medalist and TV presenter Ade Adepitan, who co-hosted this year's program, said that the eradication of polio in Africa was personal for him. "Since I was born in Nigeria, this achievement is close to my heart," said Adepitan, a polio survivor who contracted the disease as a child. "I've been waiting for this day since I was young."
- He also noted that, just a decade ago, three-quarters of all of the world's polio cases caused by the wild virus were contracted in Africa. Now, more than a billion Africans are safe from the disease.
