World & Community Spotlight Club Continues to Support Roll A Hippo!



Empowering 1000+ Women to Water and Food Security and Self Sufficiency

In most underserved settlements in South Africa, women are the frontline workers. As the covid pandemic upset the familiar family and community routines, unemployment, business failures, and social isolation became the new reality. With little income and sparse government assistance, women were faced with growing their own food to feed their families. This Rotary-driven project has provided over 1000 women (1121 across 28 communities) to date with a Survival Garden Kit. Each kit includes a hippo water roller and the basic tools, fertilizers and seedlings to start small home-site vegetable gardens, while creating water and food security through short and long-term benefits:

- Small homestead farming is doable and relatively easy (when water is readily available).
- While the need is immediate, a survival garden also creates food security for the future.
- Growing one's own food is not just self-sustaining; it's rewarding and empowering.
- While the covid pandemic was the immediate threat, its impact will be felt for years.
- A mother's drive to provide for her family is her core passion. What she needs is the 'how'.
- Basic tools and an easy way to transport water makes the Survival Garden Kit a viable option.

A hippo water roller is basically a re-invented wheelbarrow designed to transport 90 litres (24 gallons) of water – about 200 pounds – by rolling it on the ground. One trip to the water source using a hippo roller equals five trips with a bucket. The roller is made from one solid piece of UV-safe polystrene. There are no seams or welds making it extremely durable. Using a hippo roller requires no training and the benefits are immediate. It does not require spare parts or maintenance and has a life span of 5-7 years.
