The Rotary Foundation Scholarship Committee of District 7090 is pleased to be able to award 3 scholarships to deserving high school graduating students! These include:

- TWO \$1,000.00 USD Awards
- ONE \$1,500.00 USD Award for a student with a median family income of less than \$37,000 USD or Canadian /year

Scholarship Description: A general scholarship awarded to a student(s) who at the time of application are in their final year of high school education, with a commitment to enroll in postsecondary education. The scholarship is open to any area of study and must be used towards full time Canada post-secondary/U.S. post high school study at a university, college, or community college, anywhere in the world. The applicant's permanent address must be within the boundaries of District 7090, (which includes Rotary Clubs in Ontario, Canada and New York, USA).

Timelines:

Application deadline is April 15, 2023. The scholarship will be awarded no later than June 30, 2023.



District Scholarships

Scholarship Criteria: The scholarship will be based on the following criteria:

- Academic merit: high school transcripts.
- A resume of community service and/or volunteer activities completed, plus a 100 word paragraph about the impact these experiences have had on you.
- An essay of 750 words describing: why you chose your career/education path, and what community service/volunteer activities in which you plan to participate.
- Optional: letter of reference from any community member.
