Club Joins In Establishing New Ronald McDonald Family Room

The St. Catharines and area Rotary Clubs (including our own St. Catharines Lakeshore) in partnership with Niagara Health, May Court Niagara and Ronald McDonald House Charities South Central Ontario (RMHC SCO) have opened a Ronald McDonald Family Room at the Marotta Family Hospital in St. Catharines to support families with children undergoing hospital care. The organizations are working together to raise \$500,000 for the project with the Ronald McDonald Foundation contributing 25% towards the total.

Family Rooms are an extension of Ronald McDonald House. They provide respite areas directly inside the hospital to ensure that families in need can take care of themselves while remaining close to their hospitalized children. The space is located on the fourth floor, outside the Children's Health Unit, and features respite areas, laundry, no-cost food services and, in partnership with the Children's Health Unit and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, family programming such as movie nights, toy drives and more. The day-to-day operations of the room will be run by Niagara Health volunteers.
